A SURVEY OF 1,005 AMERICANS


### Methodology

- The online survey of 1,005 Americans was conducted September 3-14, 2021 using a national pre-recruited panel
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance gender, age, region, ethnicity, education, and religion to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,005 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed <u>+</u>3.3% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups


### **Definitions**

- Evangelical Beliefs are defined using the NAE Lifeway Research Evangelical Beliefs Research Definition based on respondent beliefs
- Respondents are asked their level of agreement with four separate statements using a four-point, forced choice scale (strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree, strongly disagree).
  Those who strongly agree with all four statements are categorized as having Evangelical Beliefs
  - The Bible is the highest authority for what I believe
  - It is very important for me personally to encourage non-Christians to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior
  - Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the only sacrifice that could remove the penalty of my sin
  - Only those who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their Savior receive God's free gift of eternal salvation








# 43% say that a church with Baptist in the name is not for them




# 51% say that a church with Pentecostal in the name is not for them






# 46% say that a church with Presbyterian in the name is not for them






# 47% say that a church with Lutheran in the name is not for them




#### 33% say that a church described as Nondenominational is not for them






# 46% say that a church with Southern Baptist in the name is not for them






# 46% say that a church with Assemblies of God in the name is not for them







# 57% have a favorable impression of Catholic churches



# 55% have a favorable impression of Methodist churches




# 61% have a favorable impression of Baptist churches







# 47% have a favorable impression of Pentecostal churches




# 53% have a favorable impression of Presbyterian churches




# 51% have a favorable impression of Lutheran churches




#### 57% have a favorable impression of Nondenominational churches

### **Significant Differences**

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among gender, age, ethnicity, region, and education.

### Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among religion, worship service attendance, and evangelical beliefs.

### "When I see the name Catholic in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Those age 18-34 (52%) and 35-49 (51%) are more likely to Agree than those 65+ (41%)
- Whites (52%) are more likely to Agree than Hispanics (42%) and Other Ethnicities (39%)
- Those in the South (51%) are more likely to Agree than those in the West (42%)
- Those with some college (53%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (44%)
- Other Religions (64%) are more likely to Agree than Catholics (16%) and Religiously Unaffiliated (51%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (64% v. 44%)

### "When I see the name Methodists in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Those age 65+ (47%) are more likely to Disagree than those 18-34 (38%) and 35-49 (35%)
- African Americans (52%) are more likely to Disagree than Whites (38%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (47%) are more likely to Disagree than those with some college (37%)
- Other Religions (63%) are more likely to Agree than Catholics (53%) and Religiously Unaffiliated (48%)
- Christians who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (52%) are more likely to Agree than Christians who attend less than once a month (37%)

### "When I see the name Baptist in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- African Americans (57%) are more likely to Disagree than Whites (45%)
- Those in the South (52%) are more likely to Disagree than those in the Northeast (42%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (53%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (39%) or with some college (41%)
- Other Religions are the most likely to Agree (63%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (56% v. 45%)

### "When I see the name Pentecostal in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Those in the Northeast (43%) are more likely to Disagree than those in the Midwest (32%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (58%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (47%)
- Catholics (55%) and Other Religions (62%) are more likely to Agree than Protestants (46%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (43% v. 35%)

### "When I see the name Presbyterian in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Those age 18-34 (51%) are more likely to Agree than those 50-64 (40%) and 65+ (41%)
- Hispanics (56%) are more likely to Agree than Whites (44%) and African Americans (38%)
- Protestants (44%) are more likely to Disagree than Other Religions (30%) and Religiously Unaffiliated (30%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to Agree (36%)

### "When I see the name Lutheran in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Those age 18-34 (50%) and 35-49 (52%) are more likely to Agree than those 65+ (40%)
- Hispanics (52%) are more likely to Agree than African Americans (40%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (51%) or with a Graduate Degree (53%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (43%)
- Other Religions are the most likely to Agree (65%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to Agree (37%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (55% v. 45%)

### "When I see the description Non-denominational with the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Those age 18-34 (40%) are more likely to Agree than those 50-64 (28%) and 65+ (30%)
- Whites (32%) and Hispanics (42%) are more likely to Agree than African Americans (27%)
- Those in the Northeast (38%) and West (37%) are more likely to Agree than those in the Midwest (28%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (44%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (31%) or with some college (30%)
- Protestants are the most likely to Disagree (64%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to Agree (22%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (57% v. 49%)

### "When I see the name Southern Baptist in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Those age 50-64 (47%) are more likely to Disagree than those 18-34 (36%)
- Whites (48%) and Hispanics (49%) are more likely to Agree than African Americans (33%)
- Those in the South are the most likely to Disagree (49%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (51%) or with a Graduate Degree (54%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (41%)
- Other Religions are the most likely to Agree (66%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (49% v. 39%)

### "When I see the name Assemblies of God in the name of a church, I assume it is not for me."

- Whites (48%) and Hispanics (50%) are more likely to Agree than African Americans (35%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (52%) or with a Graduate Degree (56%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (42%) or with some college (43%)
- Protestants (42%) are more likely to Disagree than Other Religions (30%) and Religiously Unaffiliated (29%)
- Christians who attend a worship service 1 to 3 times a month (46%) are more likely to Disagree than Christians who attend less than once a month (34%)

#### **Catholic**

- Those age 18-34 are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (39%)
- African Americans (19%) are more likely to select "Not familiar" than Whites (11%) and Hispanics (3%)
- Those with some college are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (42%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the most likely to select "Not familiar" (17%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (47%)
- Christians who attend a worship service 1 to 3 times a month (73%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than Christians who attend less than once a month (62%)

#### **Methodist**

- Males are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than females (27% v. 19%)
- Those age 18-34 are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (33%)
- Hispanics are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (38%)
- Those in the South (60%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those in the West (51%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (61%) or a Graduate Degree (62%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those with some college (49%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated (33%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than Catholics (19%) and Protestants (18%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the most likely to select "Not familiar" (22%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Favorable" than those without evangelical beliefs (62% v. 53%)

#### **Baptist**

- Those age 50-64 (71%) and 65+ (67%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those 18-34 (52%)
- African Americans are the most likely to select "Favorable" (82%)
- Those in the South are the most likely to select "Favorable" (70%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to select "Unfavorable" (17%)
- Protestants are the most likely to select "Favorable" (76%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated are the least likely to select "Favorable" (36%) though this is tied for the highest Favorable response among the 9 denomination names tested
- Christians who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (75%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than Christians who attend less than once a month (66%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Favorable" than those without evangelical beliefs (80% v. 56%)

#### **Pentecostals**

- Those age 50-64 (56%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those 18-34 (37%) and 65+ (45%)
- African Americans (55%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than Hispanics (41%) and Other Ethnicities (39%)
- Those in the West (35%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than those in the Midwest (26%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (36%) or a Graduate Degree (39%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than those who are High School Graduates or less (25%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (41%)
- Christians who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (63%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than Christians who attend less than once a month (48%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the most likely to select "Not familiar" (25%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Favorable" than those without evangelical beliefs (66% v. 41%)

#### **Presbyterian**

- Males are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than females (24% v. 18%)
- Those age 18-34 are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (33%)
- Whites (56%) and African Americans (60%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than Hispanics (43%) and Other Ethnicities (42%)
- Those in the Northeast (27%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than those in the Midwest (17%) and South (19%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (60%) or a Graduate Degree (59%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those with some college (47%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated (32%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than Catholics (21%) and Protestants (16%)
- Christians who attend a worship service 1 to 3 times a month are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (25%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the most likely to select "Not familiar" (25%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Favorable" than those without evangelical beliefs (63% v. 51%)

#### Lutheran

- Those age 18-34 are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (35%)
- Hispanics are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (37%)
- Those in the Midwest (57%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those in the South (47%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (57%) or a Graduate Degree (59%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those with some college (46%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (33%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select "Unfavorable" (15%) and the most likely to select "Not familiar" (27%)

#### Non-denominational

- Males are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than females (21% v. 15%)
- Those age 50-64 (63%) and 65+ (63%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those 18-34 (48%)
- Whites (60%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than Hispanics (46%)
- Those in the Midwest are the least likely to select "Unfavorable" (11%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (63%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those who are High School Graduates or less (53%)
- Protestants are the most likely to select "Favorable" (69%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated are the least likely to select "Favorable" (36%) though this is tied for the highest Favorable response among the 9 denomination names tested
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select "Unfavorable" (10%) and the most likely to select "Not familiar" (27%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Favorable" than those without evangelical beliefs (66% v. 54%)

#### **Southern Baptist**

- Males are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than females (30% v. 23%)
- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to select "Favorable" (39%)
- Hispanics are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (44%)
- Those in the South (56%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those in the Northeast (47%) and West (45%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (54%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than those with a Graduate Degree (43%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (40%)
- Christians who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (64%) are more likely to select "Favorable" than Christians who attend less than once a month (54%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the most likely to select "Not familiar" (25%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Favorable" than those without evangelical beliefs (66% v. 46%)

#### **Assemblies of God**

- Males are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than females (27% v. 21%)
- Those age 18-34 (28%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than those 50-64 (18%)
- Hispanics are the most likely to select "Unfavorable" (35%)
- Those in the Northeast (28%) and West (28%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than those in the Midwest (18%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (31%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than those who are High School Graduates or less (19%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated (34%) are more likely to select "Unfavorable" than Catholics (24%) and Protestants (20%)
- Religiously Unaffiliated are the most likely to select "Not familiar" (46%)
- Christians who attend a worship service less than once a month are the least likely to select "Favorable" (41%) and the most likely to select "Not familiar" (38%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Favorable" than those without evangelical beliefs (59% v. 39%)

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
