
Methodology

- The online survey of 1,002 Americans was conducted September 19-29, 2022, using a national pre-recruited panel
- Respondents were screened to include those who identified as Protestant/non-denominational and attend religious services at least once a month
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance gender, age, region, ethnicity, education, and religion to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,002 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed <u>+</u>3.3% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups


Definitions

- Evangelical Beliefs are defined using the NAE Lifeway Research Evangelical Beliefs Research Definition based on respondent beliefs
- Respondents are asked their level of agreement with four separate statements using a four-point, forced choice scale (strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree, strongly disagree).
 Those who strongly agree with all four statements are categorized as having Evangelical Beliefs
 - The Bible is the highest authority for what I believe
 - It is very important for me personally to encourage non-Christians to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior
 - Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the only sacrifice that could remove the penalty of my sin
 - Only those who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their Savior receive God's free gift of eternal salvation


65% intentionally spend time alone with God at least daily

Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among denomination, worship service attendance, and evangelical beliefs.

"How often do you intentionally spend time alone with God?"

- Females are more likely to select "Daily" than males (48% v. 38%)
- Those age 18-34 (21%) are more likely "Several times a week" to select than those 50-64 (13%)
- Whites (18%) and Other Ethnicities (25%) are more likely to select "Several times a week" than Hispanics (10%)
- Those in the South (49%) are more likely to select "Daily" than those in the Northeast (37%) and West (33%)
- Baptists (25%) are more likely to select "More than once a day" than Methodists (14%)
- Lutherans are the most likely to select "Less than once a month" (11%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (26%) are more likely to select "More than once a day" than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (13%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "More than once a day" than those without evangelical beliefs (30% v. 15%)

Repeat a set prayer

- Those age 18-34 (31%) and 35-49 (26%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (16%) and 65+ (11%)
- African Americans (30%) are more likely to select than Whites (16%) and Other Ethnicities (16%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (24%) are more likely to select than those with a Bachelor's Degree (15%) or a Graduate Degree (15%)
- Christian/Church of Christ (27%) are more likely to select than Presbyterian/Reformed (12%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 to 3 times a month (24%) are more likely to select than those who attend 4 or more times a month (16%)
- Those without evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those with evangelical beliefs (22% v. 16%)

Pray in my own words

- Females are more likely to select than males (86% v. 79%)
- Those age 50-64 (85%) and 65+ (89%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (77%) and 35-49 (77%)
- Those in the South (86%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (77%)
- Those with some college (86%) or with a Bachelor's Degree (86%) are more likely to select than those with a Graduate Degree (75%)
- Baptists (86%), Presbyterian/Reformed (88%), and Non-Denominational (89%) are more likely to select than Methodists (59%) and Christian/Church of Christ (71%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (85%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (79%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (92% v. 76%)

Consider God's characteristics

- Males are more likely to select than females (21% v. 16%)
- Those age 65+ are the least likely to select (10%)
- Methodists (42%) and Christian/Church of Christ (32%) are more likely to select than Baptists (14%), Lutherans (8%), Presbyterian/Reformed (12%), and Non-Denominational (15%)
- Those without evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those with evangelical beliefs (20% v. 15%)

Thank God

- Those in the South (82%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (74%)
- Baptists (84%) are more likely to select than Methodists (74%), Lutherans (71%), and Presbyterian/Reformed (72%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (87% v. 74%)

Praise God

- Females are more likely to select than males (66% v. 57%)
- African Americans (70%) are more likely to select than Whites (60%)
- Those with some college (66%) are more likely to select than those with a Graduate Degree (56%)
- Baptists (69%), Methodists (62%), and Non-Denominational (66%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (42%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (67%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (53%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (76% v. 51%)

Confess my sins

- Those age 50-64 (53%) are more likely to select than those 35-49 (43%)
- Those in the South (54%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (40%) and Midwest (43%)
- Baptists (53%) and Non-Denominational (55%) are more likely to select than Methodists (28%) and Christian/Church of Christ (39%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (55%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (38%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (64% v. 38%)

Read from the Bible or a devotional

- Females are more likely to select than males (42% v. 36%)
- Those age 50-64 (45%) and 65+ (42%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (32%) and 35-49 (34%)
- Baptists (44%), Presbyterian/Reformed (42%), and Non-Denominational (46%) are more likely to select than Methodists (17%), Lutherans (24%), and Christian/Church of Christ (20%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (46%) are more likely to select than those who 1 to 3 times a month (28%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (52% v. 29%)

Read from a Bible

- Those age 35-49 are the least likely to select (53%)
- Other Ethnicities (78%) are more likely to select than Whites (62%) and Hispanics (55%)
- Those in the South (66%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (57%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (68%) are more likely to select than those with a Graduate Degree (57%)
- Baptists (72%), Presbyterian/Reformed (63%), and Non-denominational (66%) are more likely to select than Methodists (36%) and Lutherans (46%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (70%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (52%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (78% v. 52%)

Read from a Bible that includes additional commentary or devotional thoughts

- Those age 35-49 (28%) are more likely to select than those 65+ (21%)
- Those with some college (28%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (20%)
- Methodists (37%) are more likely to select than Baptists (25%), Lutherans (20%), and Non-Denominational (18%)

Read from a devotional book that prints some Scripture

- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to select (21%)
- Whites (36%) are more likely to select than African Americans (23%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (40%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (30%) or with some college (31%)
- Methodists (43%), Lutherans (48%), and Christian/Church of Christ (45%) are more likely to select than Baptists (29%) and Non-Denominational (29%)

Read from a devotional book that doesn't print Scripture

- Those age 35-49 are the most likely to select (13%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (13%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (6%)
- Methodists (23%) are more likely to select than Baptists (6%), Lutherans (11%), Presbyterian/Reformed (2%), and Non-Denominational (5%)
- Those without evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those with evangelical beliefs (11% v. 3%)

Read Scripture from an app

- Those age 18-34 (40%) are the most likely to select followed by 35-49 (28%) and 50-64 (11%) and 65+ (9%)
- African Americans (30%) are more likely to select than Whites (16%)
- Those in the Northeast (29%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (17%) and South (17%)
- Those with some college (23%) are more likely to select than those with a Bachelor's Degree (14%) or a Graduate Degree (14%)
- Methodists (36%) are more likely to select than Baptists (16%), Lutherans (10%), Presbyterian/Reformed (6%), and Non-Denominational (24%)
- Those without evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those with evangelical beliefs (22% v. 17%)

Read a devotional from an app

- Females are more likely to select than males (9% v. 4%)
- Those age 35-49 (10%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (5%) and 65+ (4%)
- Hispanics (11%) are more likely to select than Other Ethnicities (2%)
- Those in the West (9%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (4%)
- Methodists (11%) are more likely to select than Baptists (5%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 to 3 times a month (9%) are more likely to select than those who attend 4 or more times a month (5%)
