SOURCE

Lifeway Research conducted an online discussion in July 2022 among 62 pastors of Hispanic churches and pastors of Spanish-speaking services in non-Hispanic churches. The 3-day discussion sought to understand how these churches are evangelizing and discipling believers, building community among members, and reaching next generations of children, youth, and young adults.

NOTE

This study was designed to report on the CURRENT practices of Hispanic congregations with the hope that additional research can validate which ones are BEST practices.

This research anticipates that insights gleaned from these pastors will be beneficial and insightful as you think about your church's ministry, but please remember that these findings should be considered DESCRIPTIVE rather than PRESCRIPTIVE.







How pastors say they emphasize spiritual growth in their churches













Weak discipleship strategies

- Blindly copying a discipleship model from a church dissimilar to one's own
- Not taking the time to think and plan



Low-quality systems & processes

- Oversized classes
- Irrelevant resources
- Lack of follow-through on the process
- Long and tedious programs



Neglecting the individual

- Lack of follow-up
- Pushing new believers too hard, too early
- Neglecting relationships and individualized attention



Uncommitted leadership

- Leaders living as poor examples
- Lack of discipline in prayer
- Lack of commitment to the task of discipling

Small Church Discipleship Struggles


Small churches are limited in common resources needed for ongoing discipleship.
