CHURCHGOER DIFFERENCES REPORT

Report of statistically significant differences in responses for 11 subgroups of American Evangelical and Black Protestant female churchgoers

## METHODOLOGY

- The online survey of 1,001 American Evangelical and Black Protestant female churchgoers was conducted March 13–17, 2023, using a national pre-recruited panel.
- Respondents were screened to include those whose faith group preference is an Evangelical or Black Protestant group, and attend religious services at a church in a typical month.
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance age, region, ethnicity, education, religious service attendance, and religious tradition to more accurately reflect the population.
- The completed sample is 1,001 surveys.
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed <u>+</u>3.2% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting .
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups.

## DEFINITIONS

- **Evangelical Beliefs** are defined using the NAE Lifeway Research Evangelical Beliefs Research Definition based on respondent beliefs.
- Respondents are asked their level of agreement with four separate statements using a four-point, forced choice scale (strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree, strongly disagree). Those who strongly agree with all four statements are categorized as having Evangelical Beliefs.
  - The Bible is the highest authority for what I believe.
  - It is very important for me personally to encourage non-Christians to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior.
  - Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the only sacrifice that could remove the penalty of my sin.
  - Only those who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their Savior receive God's free gift of eternal salvation.

### SIGNIFICANT STATISTICAL DIFFERENCES

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among religious tradition, worship service attendance, Sunday School/Small group attendance, evangelical beliefs, and women's ministry.

"In a typical month, about how many times (if any) do you attend small classes or groups for adults from church such as Sunday School, Bible study, small groups, **Adult Bible** Fellowships, etc?"

- Those age 18-29 (26%) and 30-49 (28%) are less likely to select "Zero" than those age 50-64 (38%) and 65+ (38%)
- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select "4 or more" (37%)
- Those age 18-29 are the most likely to select "2" (32%)
- Other ethnicities (36%) and Whites (30%) are more likely to select "4 or more" than Hispanics (19%)
- Those in the Northeast (21%) are more likely to select "2" than those in the West (11%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (33%) and a Graduate Degree (35%) are more likely to select "4 or more" than those who are High School Graduates or less (24%)
- Widowed are the least likely to select "1" (7%) and "2" (6%)
- Widowed are the most likely to select "4 or more" (40%)

"In a typical month, about how many times (if any) do you attend small classes or groups for adults from church such as Sunday School, Bible study, small groups, **Adult Bible** Fellowships, etc?" cont'd

- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month (65%) are the most likely to select "Zero" and those who attend 4 or more times are the least likely (22%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select "4 or more" (46%)
- Those whose church has attendance of 500 or more (42%) are more likely to select "Zero" than those with 50-99 (29%) and 100-249 (29%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are less likely to select "Zero" than those without evangelical beliefs (25% v. 45%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "4 or more" than those without evangelical beliefs (36% v. 19%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Evangelical are less likely to select "2" than those whose tradition is Black Protestant (14% v. 27%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the most likely to select "Zero" (53%)

"Does your church have an organized women's ministry of some kind?"

- Those age 30–49 (70%) are more likely to select "Yes" than those age 18–29 (57%) and 65+ (56%)
- Those age 18-29 (33%) are more likely to select "Nothing formal, but there are activities specifically for women" than those age 30-49 (20%) and 50-64 (19%)
- Hispanics (81%) are the most likely to select "Yes" followed by African Americans (68%), Whites (59%), and Other ethnicities (31%)
- Other ethnicities are the most likely to select "Nothing formal, but there are activities specifically for women" (38%)
- Hispanics are the least likely to select "No activities specifically for women" (2%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (67%) and 3 times a month (65%) are more likely to select "Yes" than those who attend 2 times a month (49%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 (22%) and 2 (12%) are more likely to select "Not that I know of" than those who attend 3 (4%) and 4 times a month or more (5%)

"Does your church have an organized women's ministry of some kind?" cont'd

- Those who attend small groups 3 (69%) and 4 or more times a month (70%) are more likely to select "Yes" than those who attend Zero (57%) and 1 (58%) time a month
- Those whose church has attendance of 250–499 (76%) and 500 or more (81%) are more likely to select "Yes" than those with Less than 50 (44%), 50–99 (56%), and 100–249 (66%)
- Those whose church has attendance of Less than 50 are the most likely to select "No activities specifically for women" (19%) and "Not that I know of" (17%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select "Yes" than those without evangelical beliefs (69% v. 54%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Black Protestant are more likely to select "Yes" than those whose tradition is Evangelical (73% v. 63%)

## Relationships among women in the church are stronger

- Whites (72%) are more likely to select than African Americans (59%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (73%) are more likely to select than those who are High School graduates or less (62%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (70%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (54%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (75%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (62%) and 1 (62%) a time month

## Relationships across age groups are stronger

- Those age 65+ (60%) are more likely to select than those age 18-29 (45%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (65%) are more likely to select than those who are High School graduates or less (50%)
- Married (61%) are more likely to select than Single Never Married (48%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (68%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (47%), 1 (51%), and 2 (54%) times a month
- Those whose church has attendance of 250–499 (65%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (50%) and 50–99 (53%)

#### A safe place is provided for women to be transparent about needs and hurts

- Those age 18-29 (61%) and 30-49 (64%) are more likely to select than those age 65+ (48%)
- Those in the Northeast (67%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (49%) and South (55%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (61%) and Graduate Degree (65%) are more likely to select than those who are High School graduates or less (51%)
- Divorced (62%) are more likely to select than Widowed (47%)
- Those whose church has attendance of 500 or more (69%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (51%), 50–99 (51%), and 100–249 (51%)
- Those at churches with an organized women's ministry (59%) are more likely to select than those at churches with activities for women but nothing formal (46%)

#### More ministry gets done among women

- Those age 65+ (30%) are more likely to select than those age 18-29 (17%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (33%) are more likely to select than those who are High School graduates or less (23%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month are the least likely to select (12%)
- Those who attend small groups 3 times a month (37%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (24%) and 1 (18%) time a month
- Those whose church has attendance of 250 to 499 (36%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (23%), 50–99 (24%), and 100–249 (26%)

#### More serving gets done within the church

- Those age 18-29 are the least likely to select (10%)
- Whites (30%) and African Americans (29%) are more likely to select than Hispanics (18%)
- Widowed (37%) are more likely to select than Single Never Married (24%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (32%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (17%)
- Those who attend small groups 3 times a month (41%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (23%), 1 (25%), and 2 (25%) times a month.
- Those whose church has attendance Less than 50 (32%) are more likely to select than those with 50–99 (22%)

#### More serving gets done in the community

- Those age 30-49 (32%) are more likely to select than those 18-29 (20%)
- Whites (31%) and African Americans (33%) are more likely to select than Hispanics (17%)
- Those in the Northeast (37%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (25%)
- Those who attend small groups 3 times a month (41%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (24%) and 1 (27%) time a month

## Women receive more biblical teaching than they would without it

- Those age 50–64 (36%) and 65+ (38%) are more likely to select than those age 18–29 (23%)
- Widowed (45%) are more likely to select than Single Never Married (29%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (45%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (30%), 1 (27%), and 2 (34%) times a month
- Those whose church has attendance 500 or more (44%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (33%), 50–99 (31%), and 100–249 (32%)
- Those at churches with an organized women's ministry (37%) are more likely to select than those at churches with activities for women but nothing formal (29%)

## A place is provided for women to ask questions and openly discuss faith topics

- Those who are High School graduates or less (49%) are less likely to select than those with Some college (59%), Bachelor's Degree (61%), and Graduate Degree (67%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (62%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 (47%) and 2 (52%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (69%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (51%), 1 (55%), and 2 (53%) times a month
- Those whose church has attendance 250–499 (64%) and 500 or more (65%) are more likely to select than churches with Less than 50 (52%) and 100–249 (53%)

#### Opportunities are provided for women to be refreshed and restored spiritually and emotionally

- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (68%) are more likely to select than those who attend 2 times a month (57%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (72%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (61%), 1 (59%), and 2 (60%) times a month
- Those whose church has attendance 500 or more (77%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (56%), 50–99 (62%), and 100–249 (61%)

## It encourages more of what the church as a whole is already encouraging

- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (55%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (35%) and 2 (43%) times a month
- Those whose church has attendance 500 or more (50%) are more likely to select than those with 100–249 (40%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (49% v. 38%)

## The biblical application is more relevant to women's lives

- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (32%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (20%)
- Those who attend small groups 3 times a month (40%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (25%) times a month
- Those whose church has attendance 500 or more (41%) are more likely to select than those with 50–99 (26%), 100–249 (25%), 250–499 (29%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (35% v. 25%)

## It has made me more interested in attending activities that help me spiritually

- Those age 30–49 (51%) are more likely to select than those age 65+ (39%)
- Those with Some college (50%) are more likely to select than those who have a Bachelor's Degree (39%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select (31%)
- Those whose church has attendance 100–249 (49%) and 250–499 (52%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (38%)

## I personally have been mentored by a more mature believer

- Those age 65+ (23%) are the least likely to select
- Single never married (42%) and Divorced (39%) are more likely to select than Married (30%) and Widowed (22%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (36%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (22%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month (18%) are the least likely to select

## I have developed significant relationships with women at my church

- Married (58%) are more likely to select than Single never married (48%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (61%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 (43%) and 3 (46%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select (38%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times (70%) and 1 time (64%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend 2 times a month (51%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (61% v. 48%)

## I have found a place where I can use my gifting to serve those in my church

- African Americans (44%) are more likely to select than Whites (34%) or Hispanics (29%)
- Those in the South (40%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (29%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (42%) are more likely to select than those who attend 2 (32%) and 3 (27%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month (15%) are the least likely to select
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (49%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (37%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (44% v. 26%)

## I have been more motivated to invite people to church

- Those age 30-49 (36%) are more likely to select than those age 50-64 (28%) and 65+ (21%)
- Hispanics (36%) and African Americans (32%) are more likely to select than Whites (25%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (32%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 (20%) and 2 (22%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select (13%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (39%) and 2 (37%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (24%)

## I have been more confident to present the gospel to people I know

- Those age 30-49 (34%) and 50-64 (31%) are more likely to select than those age 65+ (22%)
- African Americans (39%) are more likely to select than Hispanics (27%) and Whites (24%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (33%) are more likely to select than those who attend 2 times a month (23%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select (10%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (42%) and 3 (45%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (27%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (38% v. 19%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Black Protestant are more likely to select than those whose tradition is Evangelical (41 v. 29%)

#### It has given me tangible ways to serve people in our local community

- Those who attend a worship service 2 times a month (36%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (22%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select (18%)

#### There is more intentionality to my walk with Christ

- Those age 30-49 (43%) are more likely to select than those age 18-29 (29%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 times a month or more (44%) are more likely to select than those who attend 2 (26%) and 3 (32%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (52%) and 3 (50%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (25%), 1 (34%), and 2 (34%) times a month
- Those whose church has attendance 100–249 (41%), 250–499 (44%), and 500 or more (43%) are more likely to select than those with 50–99 (29%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (43% v. 31%)
- Those at churches with an organized women's ministry (42%) are more likely to select than those at churches with activities for women but nothing formal (26%)

- Those age 18-29 (66%) and 30-49 (61%) are more likely to select than those age 65+ (50%)
- Whites (65%) and Hispanics (57%) are more likely to select than African Americans (42%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month are the least likely to select (42%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more (63%) and 2 (61%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero times a month (51%)
- Those whose church has attendance 250–499 (68%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (49%), 50–99 (56%), and 100–249 (56%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Evangelical are more likely to select than those whose tradition is Black Protestant (60% v. 40%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select (39%)

#### Help when I feel discouraged

- Those age 30-49 (61%) and 50-64 (55%) are more likely to select than those age 65+ (42%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (57%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (47%)
- Those whose church has attendance 250–499 (58%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (47%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select (41%)

#### Dealing with struggles in my faith

- Those age 18-29 (55%) and 30-49 (50%) are more likely to select than those age 50-64 (35%) and 65+ (26%)
- Hispanics (58%) are more likely to select than Whites (36%) and African Americans (37%)
- Those in the South (44%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (31%)
- Single never married (48%) and Divorced (44%) are more likely to select than Married (35%) and Widowed (30%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select (23%)

#### Healing from hurt

- Those age 65+ are the least likely to select (29%)
- Other ethnicities (59%) are more likely to select than Whites (40%)
- Those in the South (46%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (34%) and Midwest (36%)
- Those who are High School graduates or less (47%) are more likely to select than those with a Bachelor's Degree (37%) and Graduate Degree (35%)
- Single never married (49%) and Divorced (49%) are more likely to select than Married (37%)
- Those who attend small groups 3 times a month (58%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (35%), 1 (42%), and 4 or more (44%) times a month
- Those at churches with an organized women's ministry (45%) are more likely to select than those at churches with no activities for women (31%)

#### **Feeling needed**

- Divorced (38%) are more likely to select than Married (27%)
- Those who attend small groups 2 (37%), 3 (39%), and 4 or more (37%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero (24%) and 1 (25%) times a month
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (36% v. 24%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select (19%)

#### Feeling included

- Those age 30-49 (56%) are more likely to select than those age 50-64 (46%) and 65+ (44%)
- African Americans are the least likely to select (40%)
- Divorced (56%) are more likely to select than Single never married (45%)
- Those who attend small groups 2 (53%), 3 (61%), and 4 or more (51%) times a month are more likely to select than those who attend Zero times a month (43%)
- Those whose church has attendance 250–499 (55%) are more likely to select than those with Less than 50 (41%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Evangelical are more likely to select than those whose tradition is Black Protestant (50% v. 39%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select (30%)

### Support when difficult things happen

- Those age 30-49 (65%) and 50-64 (61%) are more likely to select than those age 65+ (53%)
- Other ethnicities (74%) are more likely to select than African Americans (56%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (62%) are more likely to select than those who attend 3 times a month (52%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (64%) are more likely to select than those who attend Zero times a month (54%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select (50%)

"What needs have you been hoping women's ministry activities in your church would help you with personally?"

### Growing closer to Jesus Christ

- Hispanics (85%) are more likely to select than Whites (70%) and African Americans (69%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (75%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 (58%) and 2 (65%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select (62%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (78% v. 62%)
- Those at churches with an organized women's ministry are the most likely to select (77%)

"What needs have you been hoping women's ministry activities in your church would help you with personally?"

### None of these

- Those age 65+ (13%) are more likely to select than those age 30-49 (3%)
- Widowed (15%) are more likely to select than Single never married (8%) and Married (5%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the most likely to select (13%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the most likely to select (21%)

### **Making friends**

- Those age 18–29 (18%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" than those age 50–64 (8%)
- Those who attend a worship service 2 times a month (22%) are more likely to select "Our church has not offered any women's ministry activities to address this" than those who attend 3 (9%) and 4 or more (7%) times a month
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (82%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" than those who attend 2 times a month (68%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero (16%), 1 (13%), and 2 (13%) times a month are more likely to select "Our church has not offered any women's ministry activities to address this" than those who attend 4 or more times a month (4%)

### Making friends cont'd

- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the most likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" (20%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" (65%)
- Those whose church has attendance Less than 50 (16%) and 50–99 (17%) are more likely to select "Our church has not offered any women's ministry activities to address this" than those with 250–499 (6%) and 500 or more (2%)
- Those whose church has attendance 100-249 (83%) and 250-499 (86%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" than those with Less than 50 (72%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" (29%)

### Help when I feel discouraged

- Those age 65+ are the least likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" (4%)
- Those age 65+ (82%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" than those age 18–29 (67%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (19%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" than those with Some college (5%) and Bachelor's Degree (8%)

#### Help when I feel discouraged cont'd

- Those with Some college (84%) and Bachelor's Degree (82%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" than those with a Graduate Degree (67%)
- Single never married (13%) and Married (11%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" than Widowed (2%)
- Widowed (90%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" than Single never married (72%)

#### Help when I feel discouraged cont'd

- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (82%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" than those who attend 1 time a month (66%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero (17%) times a month are more likely to select "Our church has not offered any women's ministry activities to address this" than those who attend 1 (7%), 3 (4%), and 4 or more (9%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month (16%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" than those who attend 2 (6%) and 4 or more (5%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" (66%)

- Those whose church has attendance Less than 50 (20%) are more likely to select "Our church has not offered any women's ministry activities to address this" than those with 100–249 (10%), 250–499 (9%) and 500 or more (2%)
- Those whose church has attendance 500 or more (17%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" than those with Less than 50 (7%) and 250–499 (7%)
- Those churches with no activities for women are the least likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities that have helped me" (40%)

### Dealing with struggles in my faith

- Whites (15%) are more likely to select "Our church has not offered any women's ministry activities to address this" than Hispanics (5%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (22%) are more likely to select "My church has offered women's ministry activities but they haven't helped me" than those with Some college (9%)

- Those age 65+ (28%) are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those age 30-49 (17%)
- Those in the Northeast are the least likely to Disagree (1%)
- Those in the West (13%) and Midwest (12%) are more likely to Disagree than those in the Northeast (1%)
- Those with Some college (73%) are more likely to Agree than those with a Graduate Degree (61%)
- Married (72%) are more likely to Agree than Divorced (62%)

- Those whose church has attendance 500 or more (31%) are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those with 50–99 (20%), 100–249 (19%), and 250–499 (17%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (79% v. 56%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are less likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (16% v. 29%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are less likely to Disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (5% v. 15%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to Agree (55%) and the most likely to Disagree (15%)

- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (81%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend 1 (68%) and 3 (72%) times a month
- Those who attend a worship service 1 (25%) and 3 (21%) times a month are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those who attend 4 or more times a month (15%)

- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the most likely to Neither agree nor disagree (27%)
- Those whose church has attendance 50–99 (83%) are more likely to Agree than those with 500 or more (71%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (84% v. 70%)
- Those at churches with no activities for women are the least likely to Agree (68%)

"I am intentionally putting my spiritual gift(s) to use serving God and others."

- Whites (18%) and Other ethnicities (23%) are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than Hispanics (9%)
- Hispanics are the most likely to Disagree (13%)
- Those with Some college (83%) and a Bachelor's Degree (82%) are more likely to Agree than those with a Graduate Degree (73%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (83%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend 1 (67%) and 3 (73%) times a month
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month (25%) are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those who attend 4 or more times a month (13%)

"I am intentionally putting my spiritual gift(s) to use serving God and others." cont'd

- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to Agree (64%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (90%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend 1 time a month (80%)
- Those who attend small groups Zero (25%) and 1 (18%) times a month are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those who attend 2 (9%) and 4 or more (9%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month (11%) are more likely to Disagree than those who attend 1 (2%) and 4 or more (1%) times a month
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (86% v. 70%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are less likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (11% v. 22%)

- Those age 65+ (36%) are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those age 30-49 (21%) and 50-64 (27%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (64%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend 1 (42%) and 3 (53%) times a month
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month (25%) are more likely to Disagree than those who attend 2 (13%) and 4 or more (9%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the least likely to Agree (41%)
- Those who attend 3 times a month (80%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend Zero (41%), 1 (62%), and 2 (67%) times a month

- Those who attend small groups Zero (36%) times a month are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those who attend 1 (24%), 3 (15%) and 4 or more (24%) times a month
- Those who attend small groups Zero times a month are the most likely to Disagree (24%)
- Those whose church has attendance Less than 50 (33%) and 250–499 (32%) are more likely to Neither agree nor disagree than those with 50–99 (22%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (67% v. 49%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are less likely to Disagree than those without evangelical beliefs (8% v. 19%)
- Those at churches with an organized women's ministry (62%) are more likely to Agree than those at a church with no activities for women (52%)

"The Bible is the highest authority for what I believe." • No meaningful significant differences

"It is very important for me personally to encourage non-Christians to trust Jesus Christ as their savior."

- Those in the South (95%) are more likely to Agree than those in the Northeast (89%)
- Those who attend a worship service 2 times a month (92%) and 4 or more times a month (97%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend 1 time a month (83%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (98%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend Zero (88%) and 2 (94%) times a month
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (100% v. 86%)

"Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the only sacrifice that could remove the penalty of my sin." • No meaningful significant differences

"Only those who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their savior receive God's free gift of eternal salvation."

- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to Agree (97%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to Agree than those without evangelical beliefs (100% v. 86%)
