REPORT OF STATISTICALLY SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES IN RESPONSES FOR 10 SUBGROUPS OF PASTORS AND CHURCHES

Sponsored by Lifeway Recursos, Billy Graham Evangelistic Association (BGEA), and Samaritan's Purse







Methodology

- The online survey of 554 pastors of Hispanic Congregations in the U.S. was conducted September 12 – November 1, 2023
- Respondents were invited by individual denominations and networks (see following slide). Invitations were primarily made by email providing pastors with a link to the online survey
- Each respondent was screened to ensure they were the senior pastor or the pastor of the Hispanic campus or Spanish-speaking congregation
- Respondents were screened to ensure the congregation was a Hispanic or multiethnic church or a Spanish-speaking worship service or campus within a non-Hispanic church (Pastors of a campus or Spanish-speaking worship service were instructed to only answer for that campus/service)
- Only congregations that are at least 50% Hispanic were included
- Slight weights were used to adjust for varying response rates across denominations
- The completed sample is 554 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error does not exceed <u>+</u>5.2% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups.

Q14 "What language(s) are used to lead your worship services?"

- Those in Puerto Rico are the most likely to select "All in Spanish" (99%)
- Those in the Midwest (74%) and South (73%) are more likely to select "All in Spanish" than those in the Northeast (48%) and West (59%)
- Those at multiethnic churches are the least likely to select "All in Spanish" (19%)
- Those at multiethnic churches are the most likely to select "All Bilingual" (47%)
- Those at churches with average attendance of 0-49 are the most likely to select "All in Spanish" (81%) followed by those with attendance of 50-99 (72%), 100-249 (58%) and 250+ (40%)
- Those at less acculturated churches are more likely to select "All in Spanish" than those at more acculturated churches (78% v. 27%)
- Those at more acculturated churches are more likely to select "All Bilingual" than those at less acculturated churches (42% v. 12%)

- Those who are High School Graduates or less (84%) are more likely to select "All in Spanish" than those with a Bachelor's Degree (65%) or with a Graduate Degree (65%)

- 2nd generation pastors are the least likely to select "All in Spanish" (40%) and the most likely to select "All Bilingual" (33%) and "Separate services for Spanish, English, and/or Bilingual" (21%)

- Those in the West (28%) are more likely to select "Yes, translation into English" than those in the Midwest (15%)
- Those at multiethnic churches are the most likely to select "Yes, translation into Spanish" (12%)
- Those at churches with average attendance of 0-49 (90%) are more likely to select "No translation" than those at churches with attendance of 50-99 (73%), 100-249 (64%), and 250+ (52%)
- Those at more acculturated churches are more likely to select "Yes, translation into Spanish" than those at less acculturated churches (14% v. 0%)
- Those at less acculturated churches are more likely to select "Yes, translation into English" than those at more acculturated churches (25% v. 6%)

- Those who are High School Graduates or less (30%) or with a Bachelor's Degree (28%) are more likely to select "Yes, translation into English" than those with a Graduate Degree (18%)
- 3rd generation+ pastors (80%) are more likely to select "No translation" than 2nd generation pastors (64%)
- 2nd generation pastors are the most likely to select "Yes, translation into Spanish" (16%)

- Those in Puerto Rico (95%) are more likely to select "Church building" than those in the Northeast (78%)
- Those at a Spanish language congregation (92%) are more likely to select "Church building" than those at a multiethnic church (80%)
- Those at churches with average attendance of 0-49 are the least likely to select "Church building" (71%)
- Those employed full-time (87%) are more likely to select "Church building" than those who volunteer (76%)

- Those in Puerto Rico (43%) are more likely to select "Contemporary" than those in the Northeast (16%), South (21%), and West (20%)
- Those in the Northeast (32%) and West (33%) are more likely to select "Pentecostal" than those in the Midwest (14%)
- Those at multiethnic churches (29%) are more likely to select "Pentecostal" than those at a Spanish language congregation (14%)
- Those at multiethnic churches are the least likely to select "Traditional" (3%)

- Those at churches with average attendance of 0-49 (53%) are more likely to select than those at churches with attendance of 250+ (33%)
- Those age 18-39 (72%) and 65+ (61%) are more likely to select than those 40-49 (38%) and 50-64 (44%)
- Males are more likely to select than females (47% v. 32%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree are the most likely to select (58%)
- Those employed full-time (52%) are more likely to select than those who volunteer (33%)
- Mainlines are more likely to select than Evangelicals (59% v. 44%)

- Those at a multiethnic church (75%) are more likely to select than those at Hispanic churches (62%) and a Spanish language congregation (59%)
- Those at churches with average attendance of 250+ are the most likely to select (86%)
- Those at more acculturated churches are more likely to select than those at less acculturated churches (78% v. 61%)
- Those age 40-49 (71%) and 50-64 (68%) are more likely to select than those 65+ (41%)
- Those who volunteer (76%) are more likely to select than those who are employed full-time (60%)
- Evangelicals are more likely to select than Mainlines (68% v. 50%)
- 2nd generation pastors are the most likely to select (83%)

- Those in the Northeast (46%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (23%) and West (26%)
- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (46%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (37%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (22%) and those with some college (22%)
- Mainlines are more likely to select than Evangelicals (42% v. 28%)

Songs written by Hispanic worship leaders

- Those in the West are the least likely to select (25%)
- Those at churches with average attendance of 250+ (51%) are more likely to select than those at churches with attendance of 0-49 (35%) and 50-99 (32%)
- Those at more acculturated churches are more likely to select than those at less acculturated churches (44% v. 33%)
- Those age 65+ are the least likely to select (21%)
- 2nd generation pastors (48%) are more likely to select than 1st generation pastors (31%)

- Those with some college (92%) or with a Bachelor's Degree (95%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (80%)
- Those employed full-time (94%) are more likely to select than those who are part-time (84%), bi-vocational (87%), and volunteers (81%)

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (36%)

- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (80%) are more likely to select than those with a Graduate Degree (66%)
