Methodology

- The online survey of 554 pastors of Hispanic Congregations in the U.S. was conducted September 12 – November 1, 2023
- Respondents were invited by individual denominations and networks (see following slide). Invitations were primarily made by email providing pastors with a link to the online survey
- Each respondent was screened to ensure they were the senior pastor or the pastor of the Hispanic campus or Spanish-speaking congregation
- Respondents were screened to ensure the congregation was a Hispanic or multiethnic church or a Spanish-speaking worship service or campus within a non-Hispanic church (Pastors of a campus or Spanish-speaking worship service were instructed to only answer for that campus/service)
- Only congregations that are at least 50% Hispanic were included
- Slight weights were used to adjust for varying response rates across denominations
- The completed sample is 554 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error does not exceed <u>+</u>5.2% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups.

Limitations


Even this robust sampling effort (554 completed surveys from more than 25 denominations) still has limitations.

Great efforts were made to connect with known groups of Hispanic congregations. Congregations in denominations and faith groups listed on the survey invitations page were invited in the most comprehensive manner. Some denominations were not able to participate during the timeframe of this study.

The full number of non-denominational Hispanic congregations in the U.S. is not known. The large networks who were invited should represent above average sampling but may not match the coverage of invitations within denominations.

Hispanic congregations that exist as a Spanish-speaking service within a non-Hispanic church may be under-represented. While all known congregations were invited by cooperating groups, it is likely that some Spanish-speaking services have not yet identified themselves to their denomination or networks since the entire church already has affiliations of its own.

85% of participating Hispanic congregations are Hispanic or multiethnic churches



Current ethnic make-up of participating congregations (Means)





62% of participating congregations were established in 2000 or later




Current immigrant breakdown of participating congregations (Means)

- 1st Gen Born outside of the United States 62%
- 2nd Gen Were born in the United States, 25% but have parents who were born outside of the United States
- 3rd Gen+ Were born in the United States 13% and so were their parents




69% conduct worship services in Spanish; 18% conduct bilingual services





Hispanic congregations are 4 times as likely to be Less Acculturated than More Acculturated




83% use a church building as a primary facility for worship services; 6% use a retail or commercial space








"Which of the following types of songs are sung regularly in your worship services?"




Pastoral prayer in worship gatherings


Prayers of intercession for the sick and needy in worship gatherings




Congregational reading used in worship gatherings


Testimonies used in worship gatherings


Scripture reading used in worship gatherings


Greeting one another in worship gatherings


Reciting creed(s) used in worship gatherings




Children's stories used in worship gatherings






Invitation to respond or altar call used in worship gatherings


"Which of the following tools or instruments does your church use at least once a month in your worship gatherings?"













88% of bi-vocational pastors work 20 or more hours a week at an outside job



















"Which of the following are personal areas that you find challenging today?"




"Do you meet at least once a month and openly share your struggles with any of the following?"


Churches, as they serve their community, are split on whether they seek to minister to all people or all Hispanics














Gender of participating pastors




Self-identified theological beliefs of participating pastors of Hispanic congregations




