Methodology

The study was originated and commissioned by the Institute for Faith & Culture.

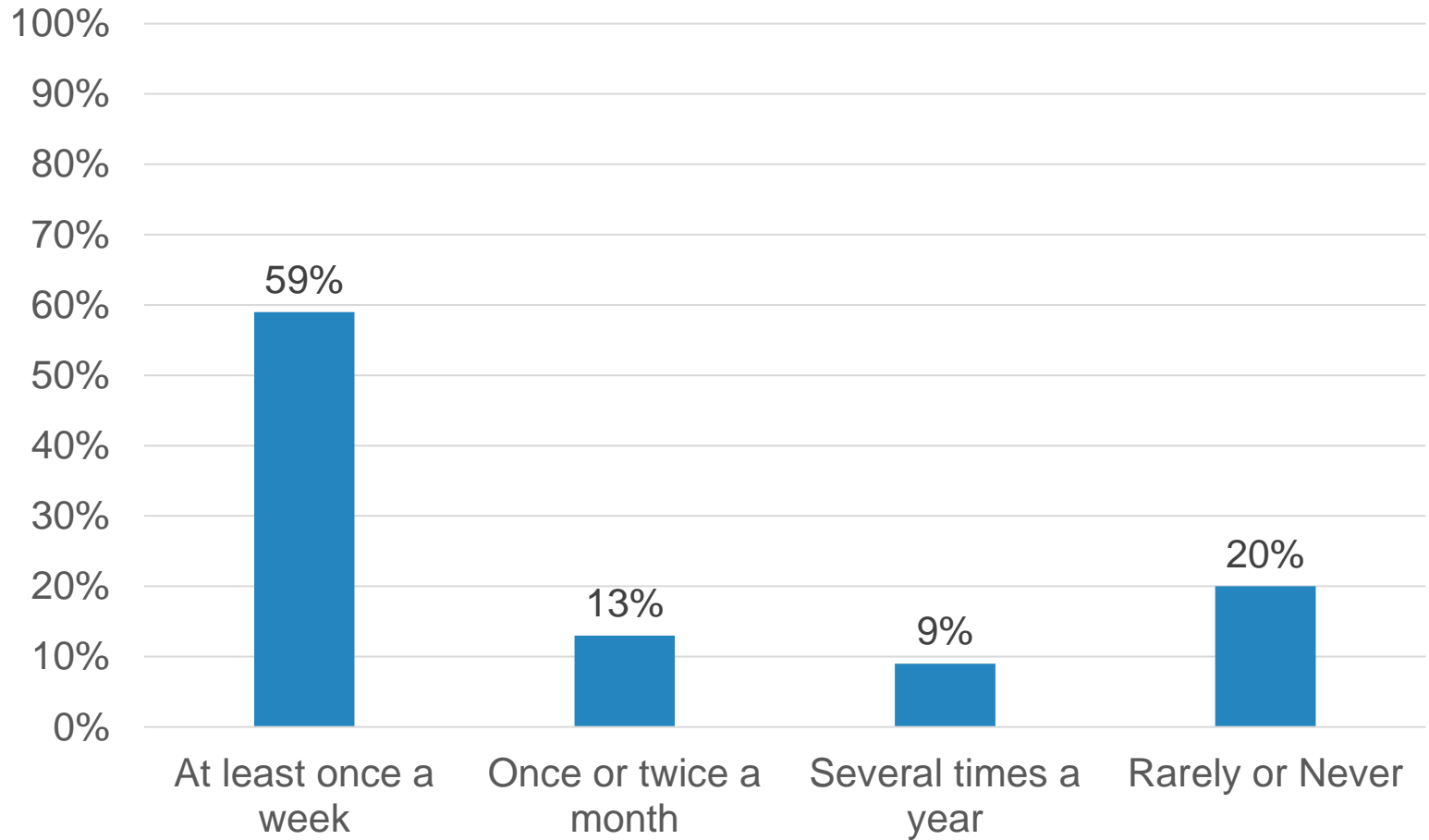
- The online survey of 1,000 American Evangelicals was conducted July 18 – August 2, 2024, using a national pre-recruited panel
- Respondents were screened to include those who identified as Protestant/non-denominational and whose church is non-denominational or in a denomination that is within the evangelical religious tradition
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance gender, age, region, ethnicity, education to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,000 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed $\pm 3.3\%$. This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups

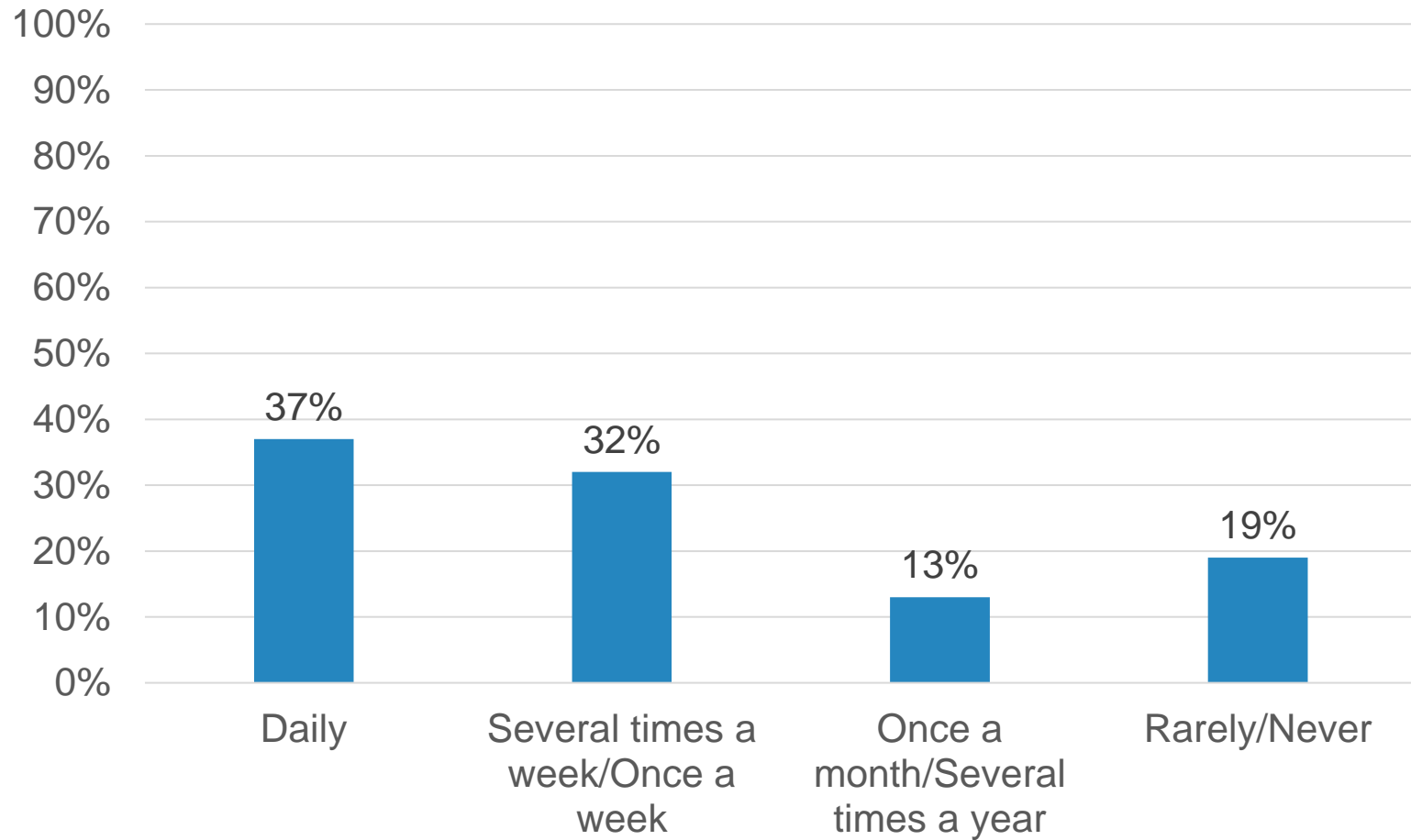

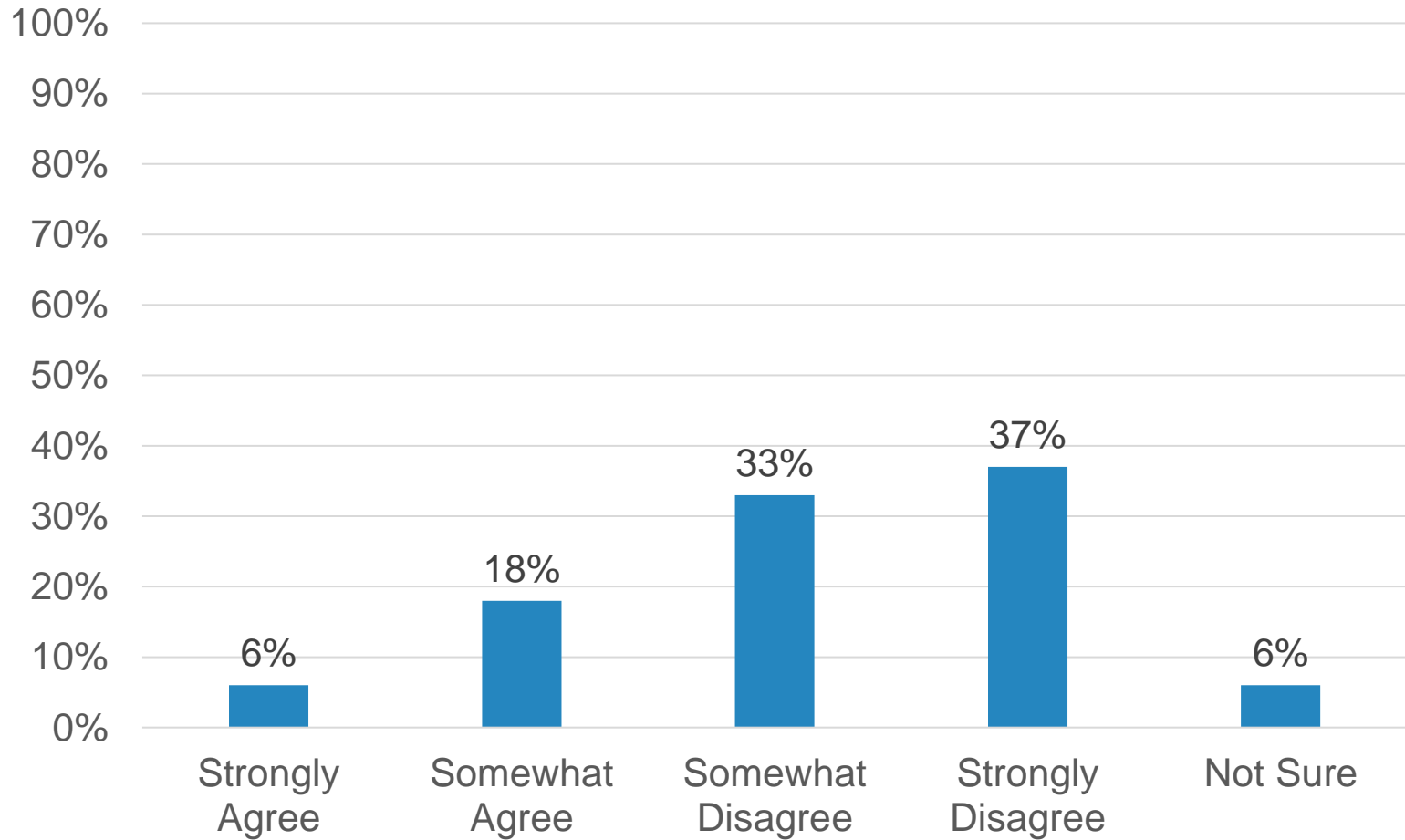

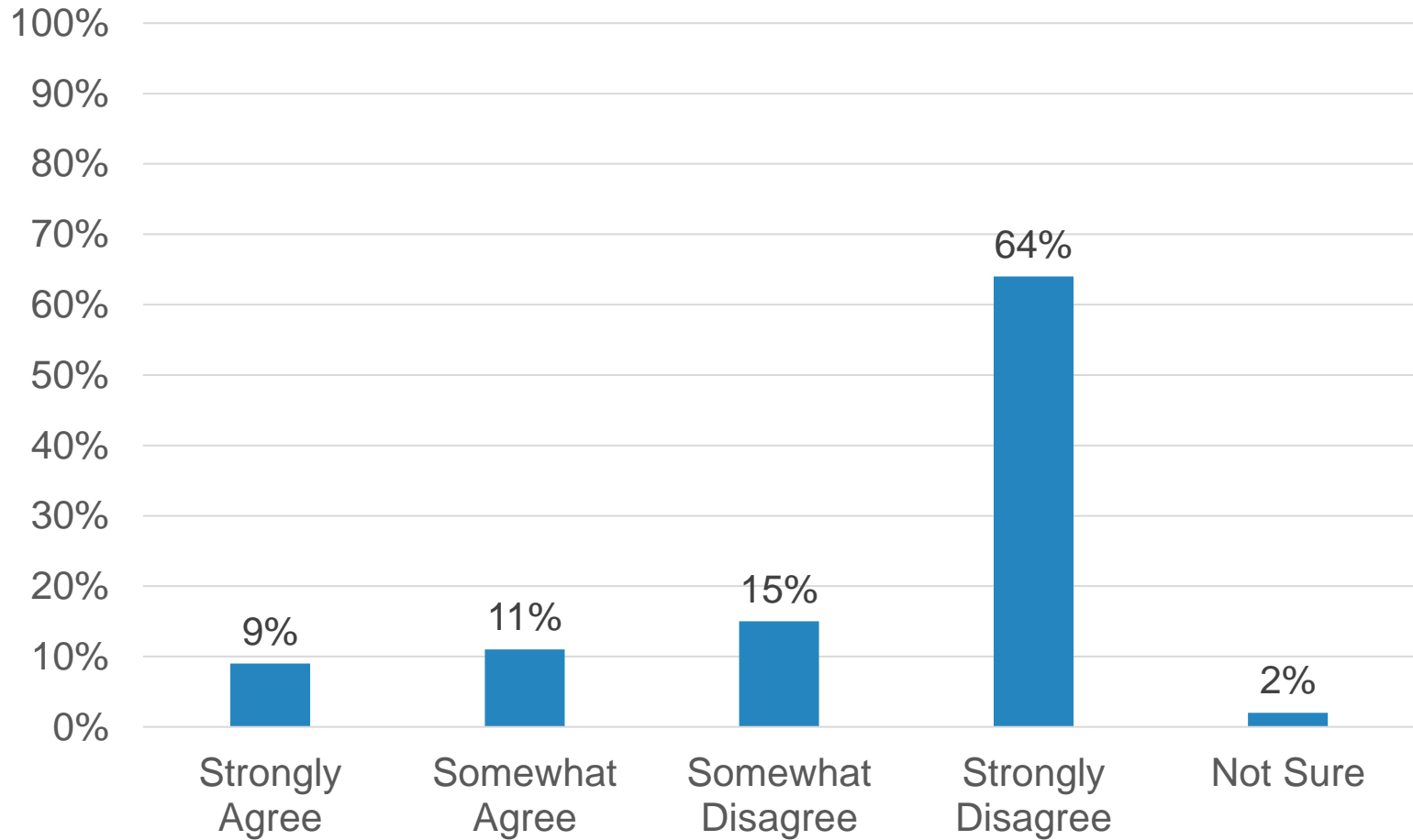

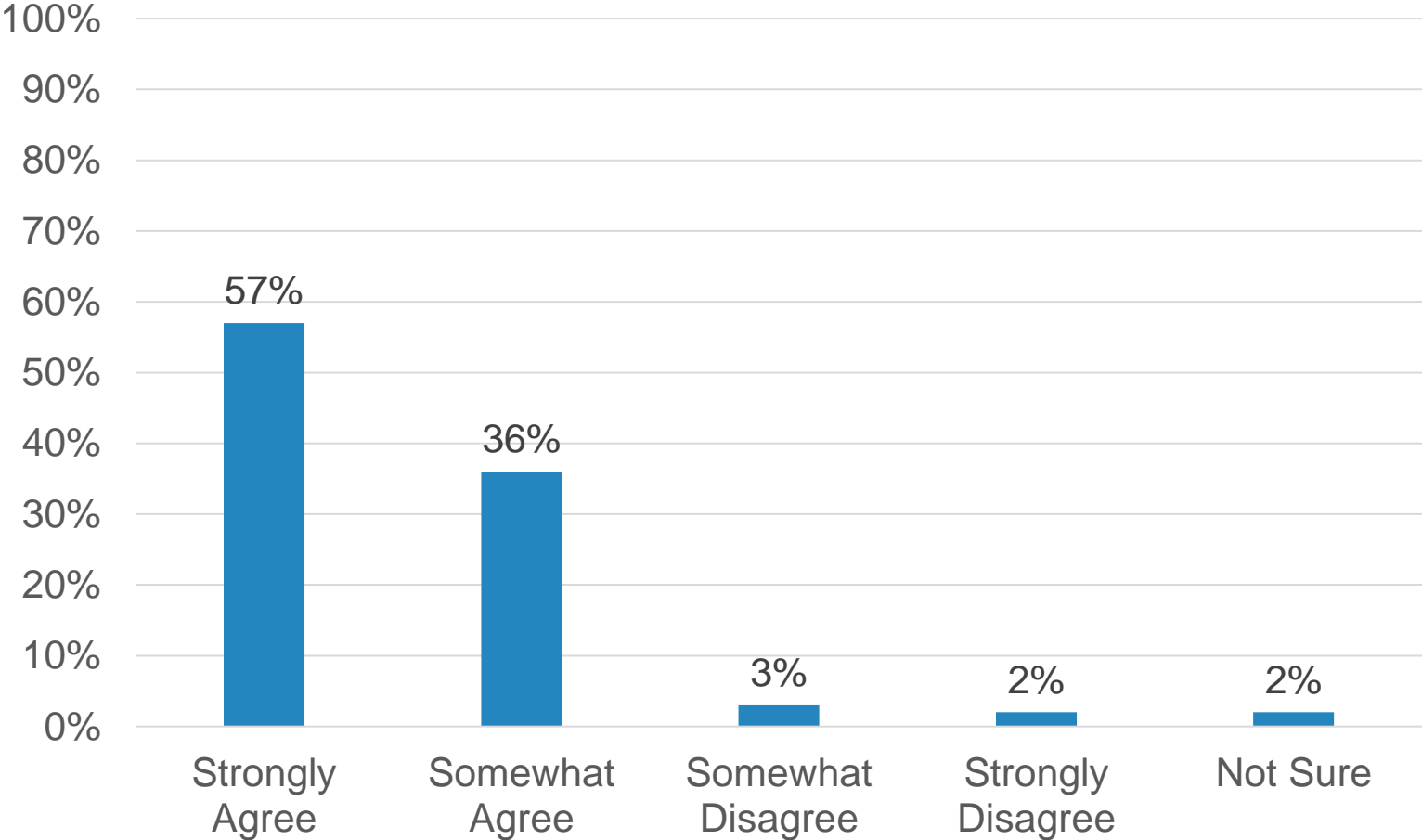

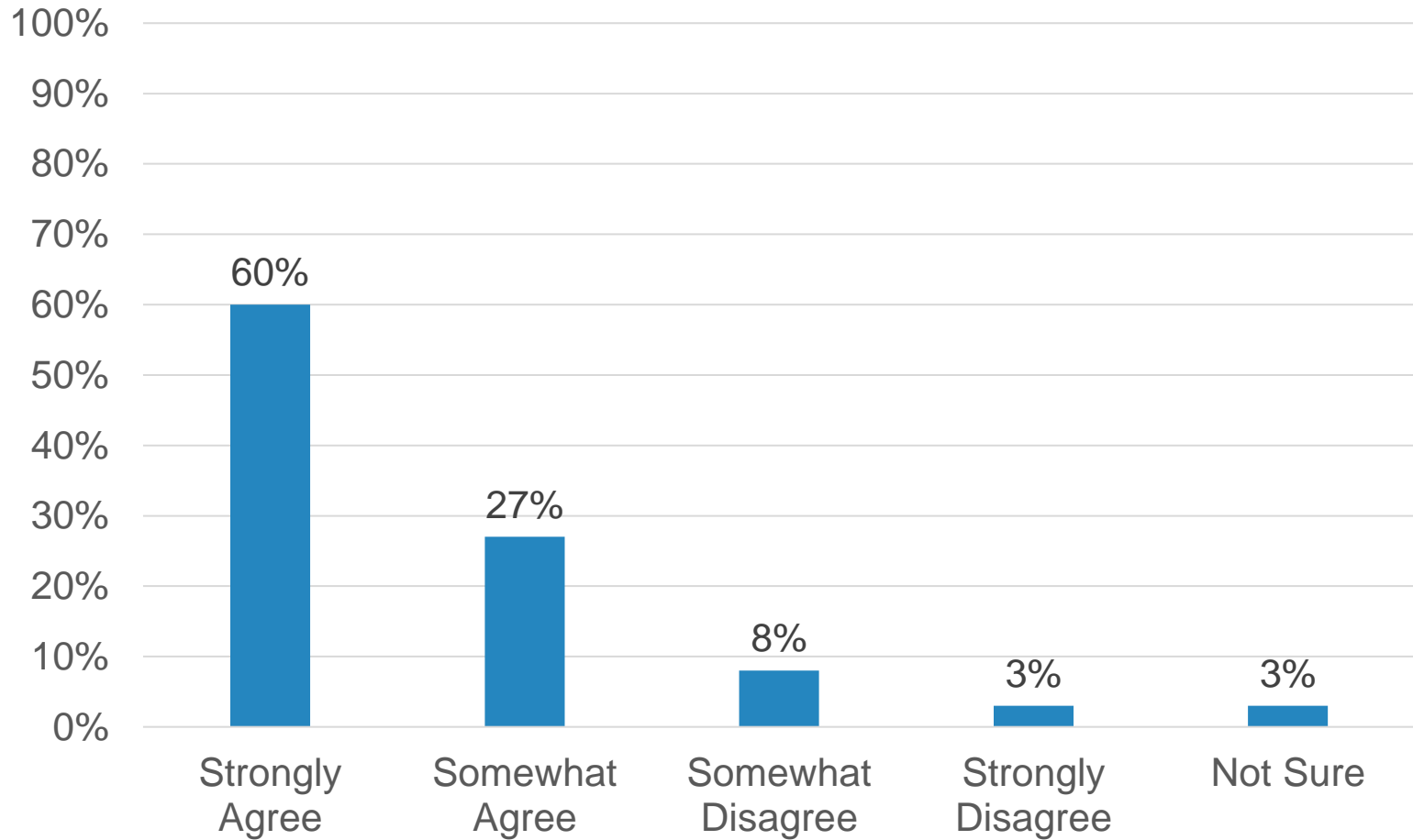

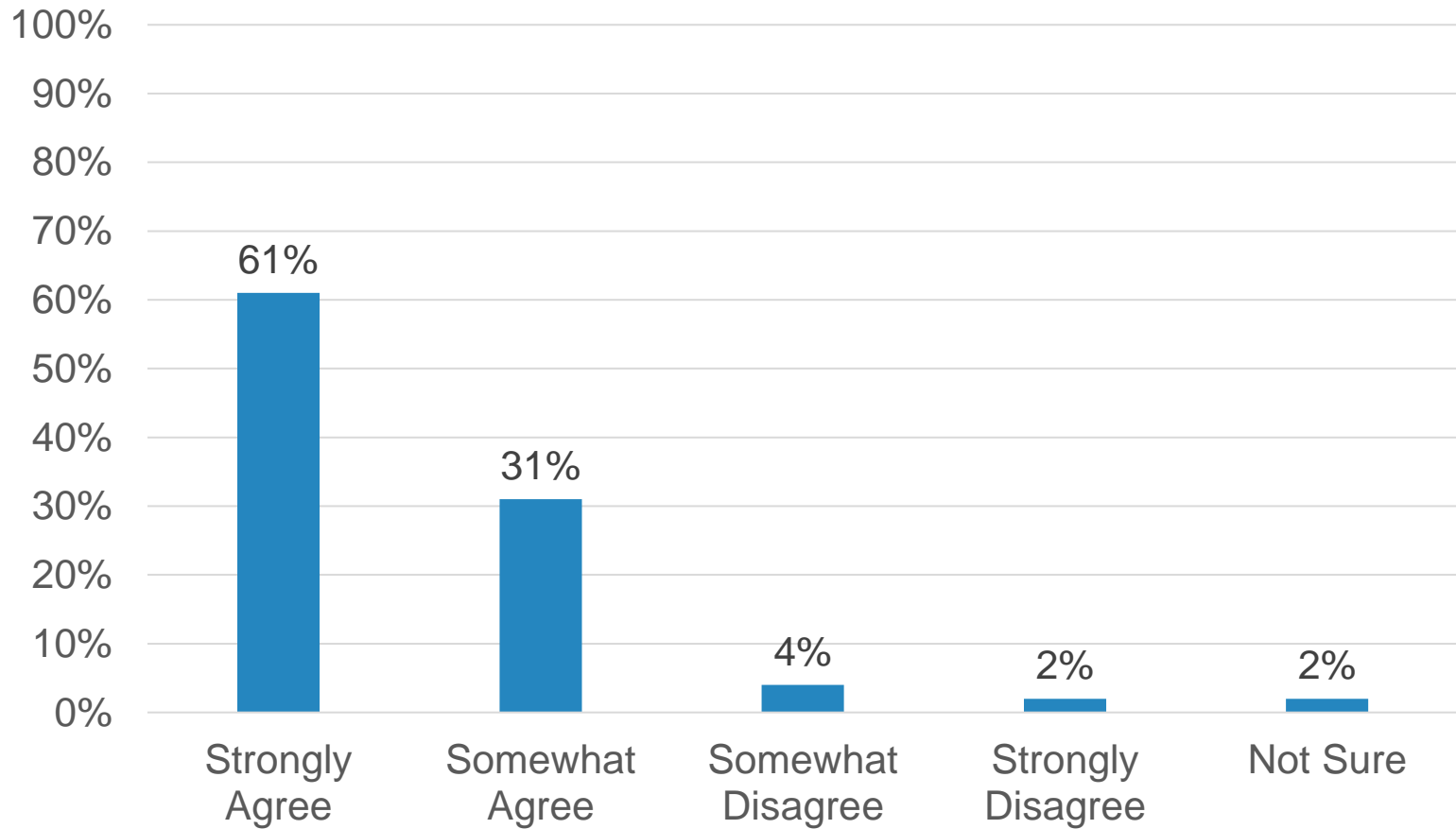

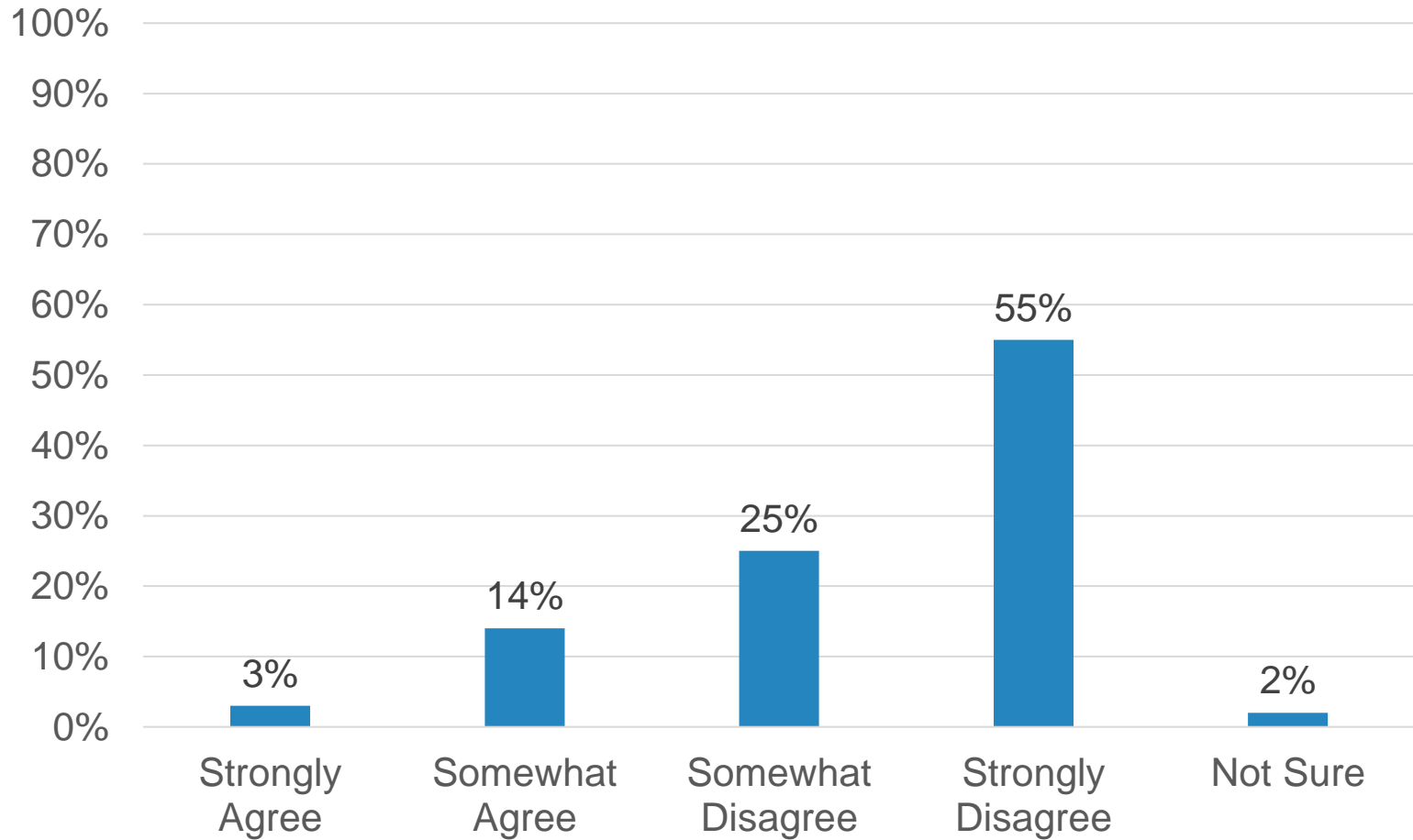

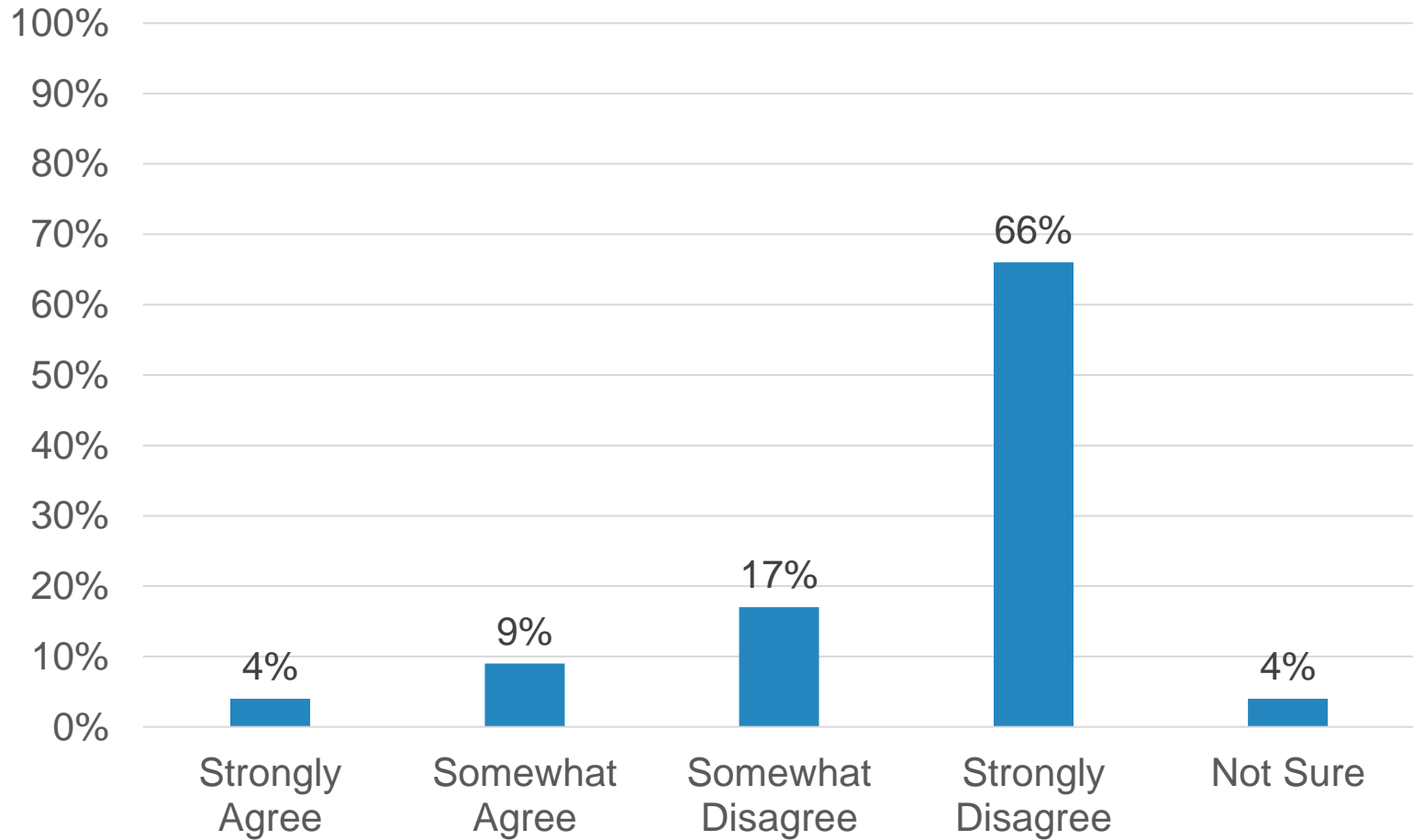

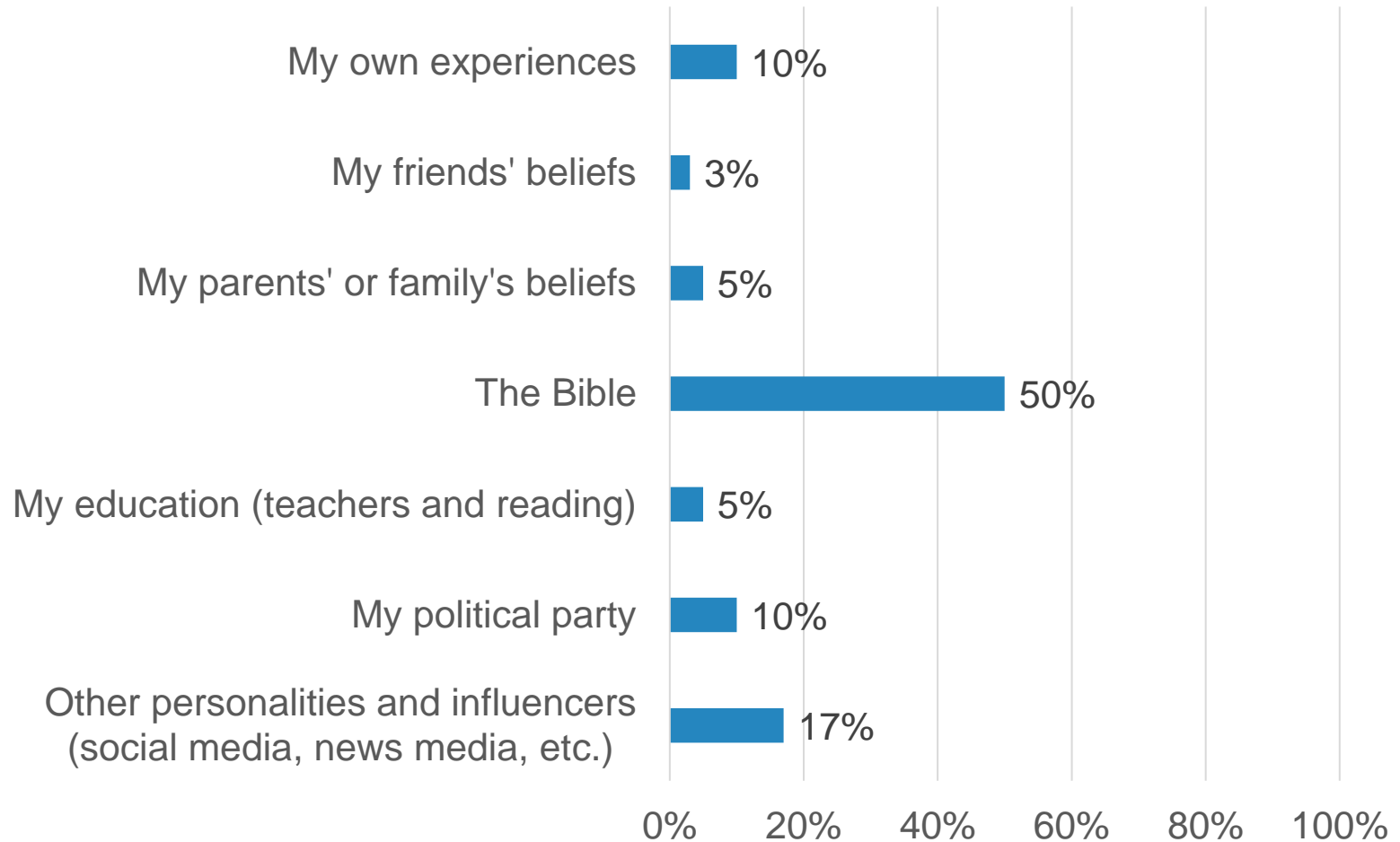

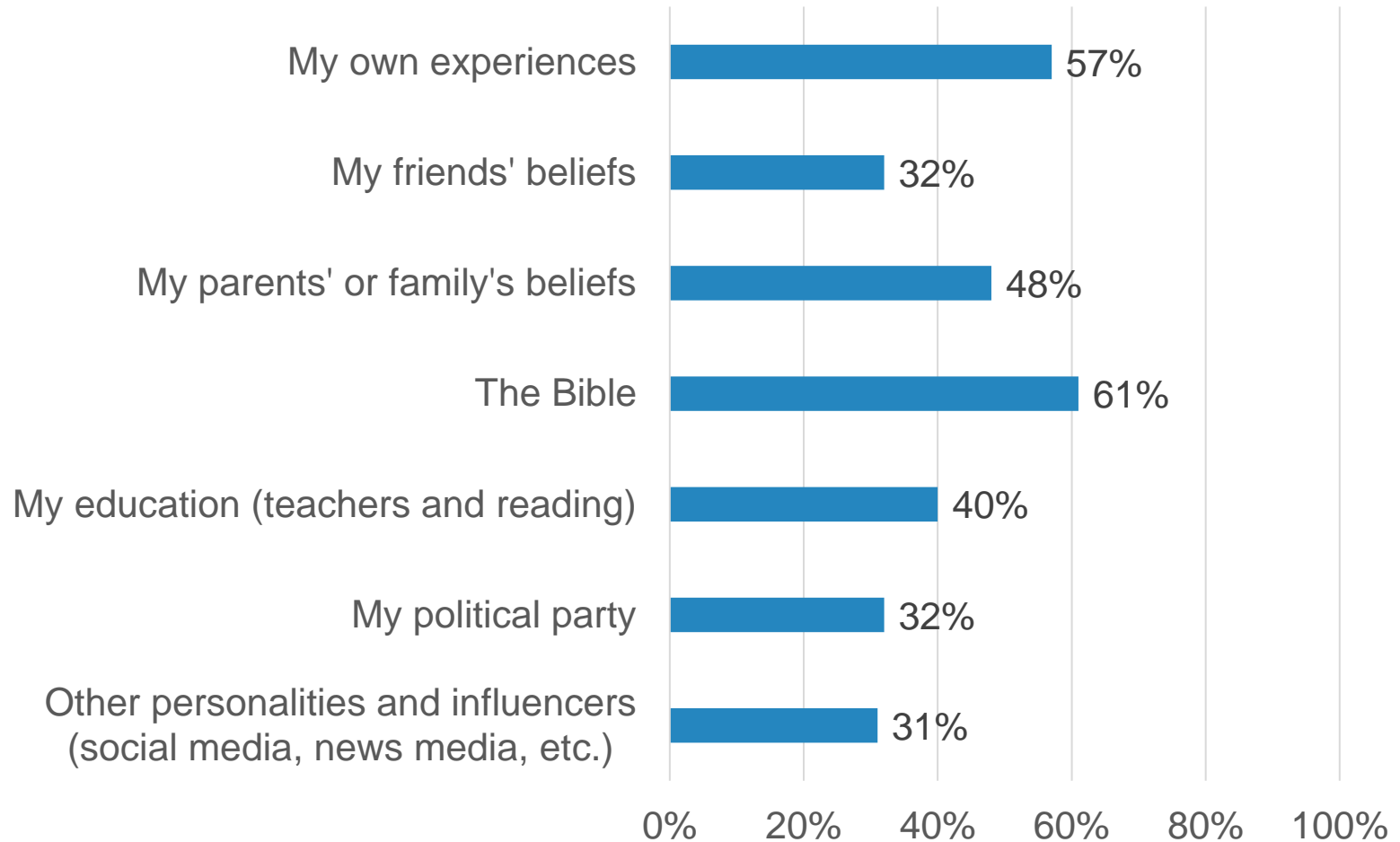

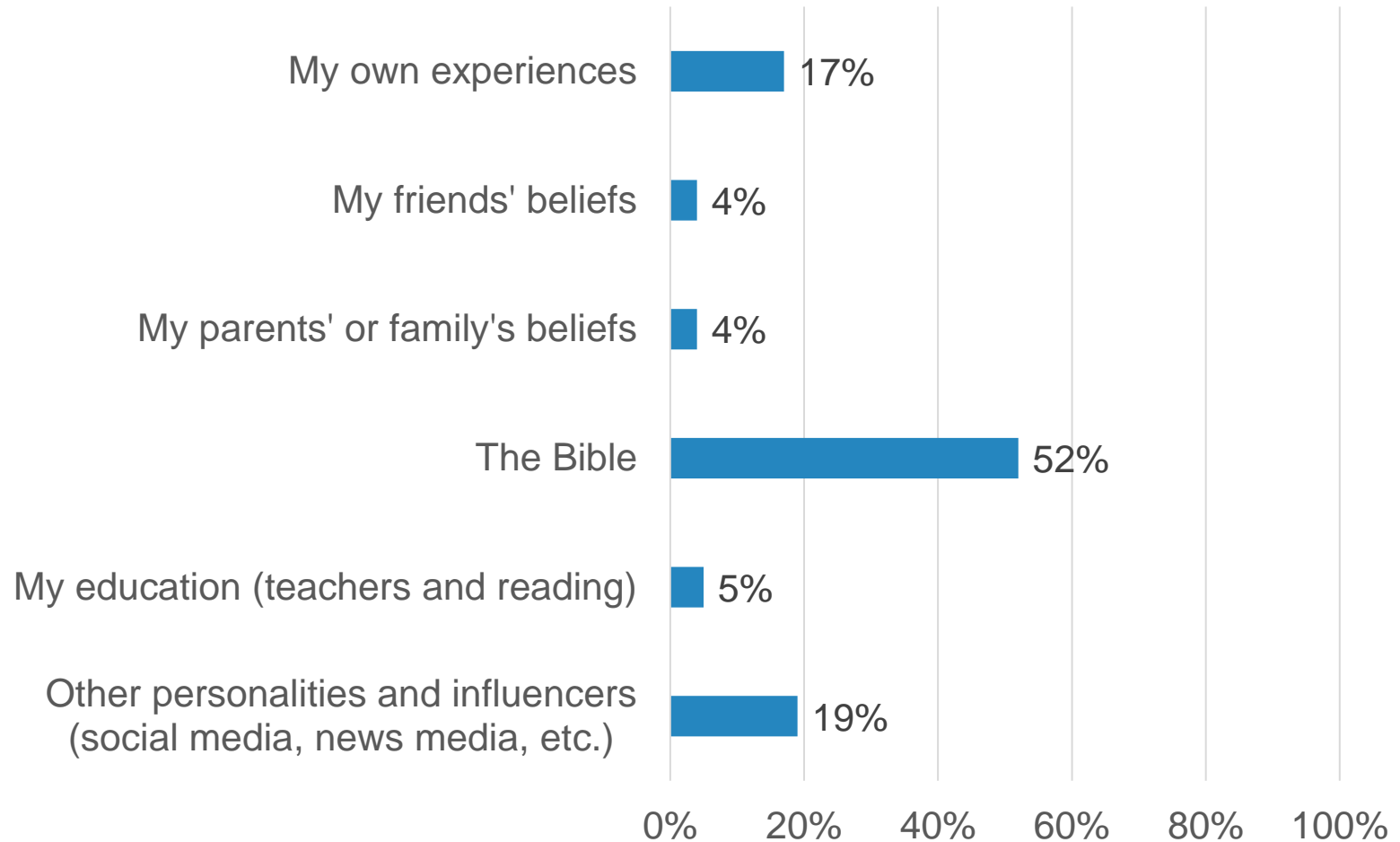

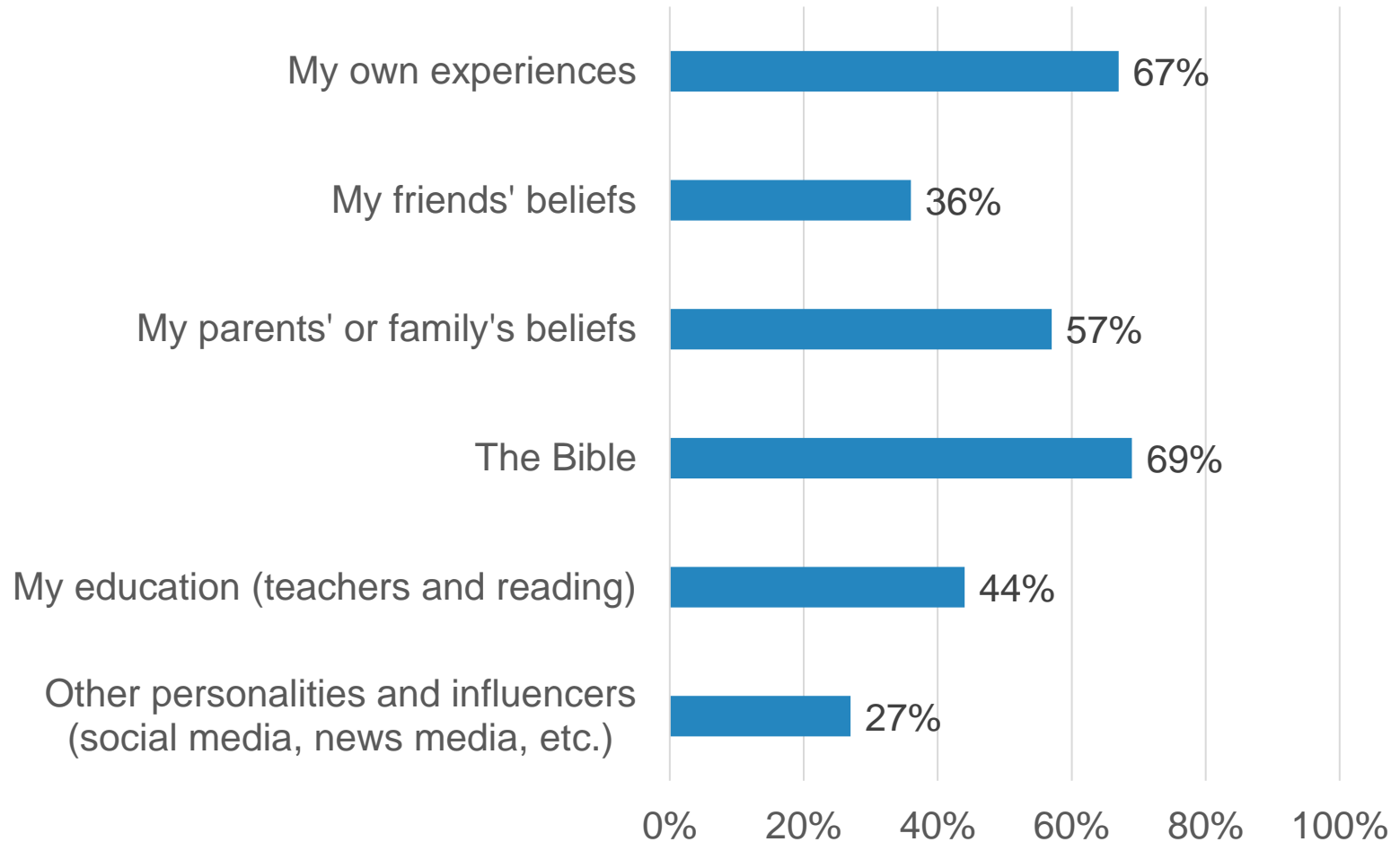

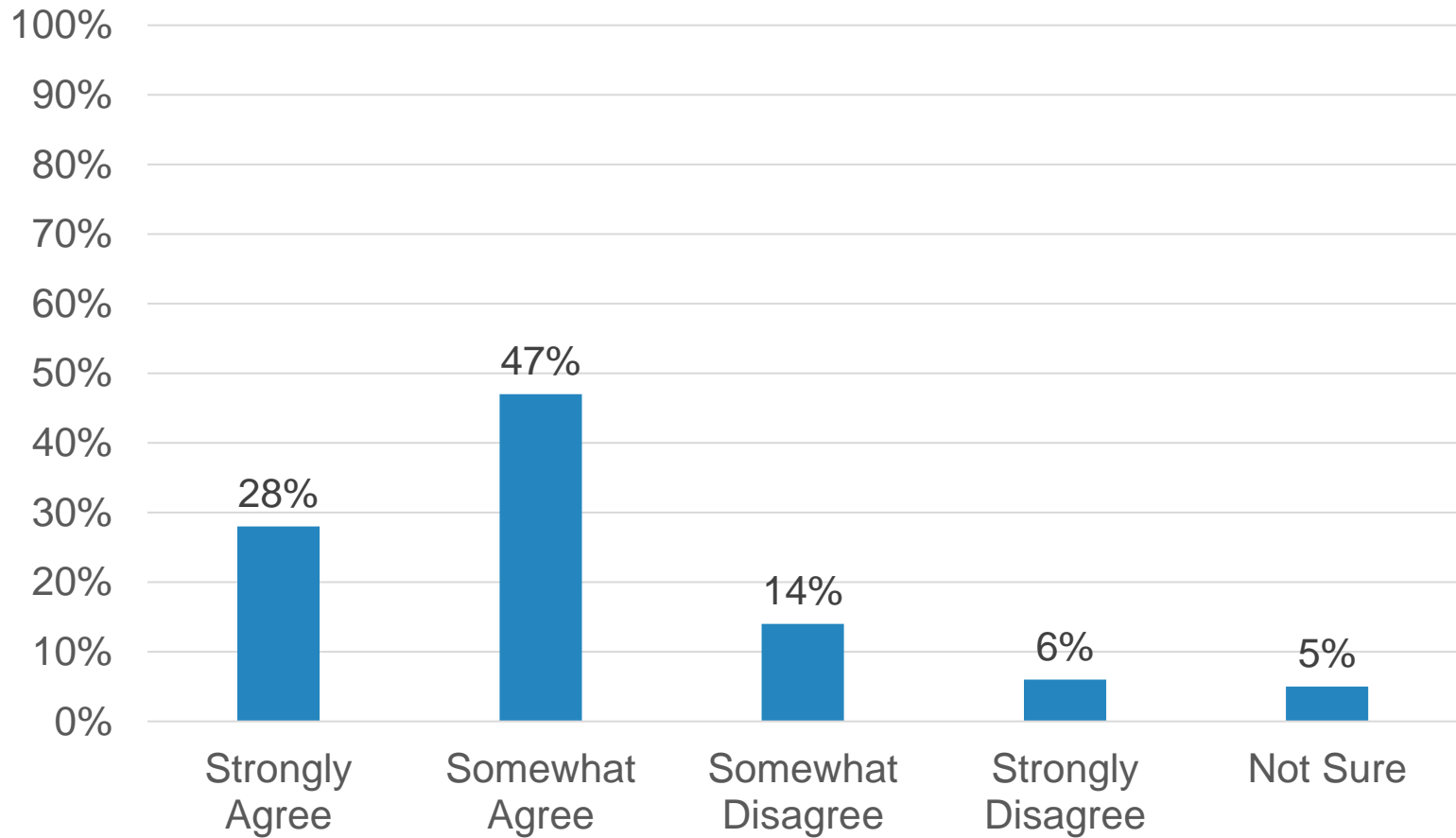

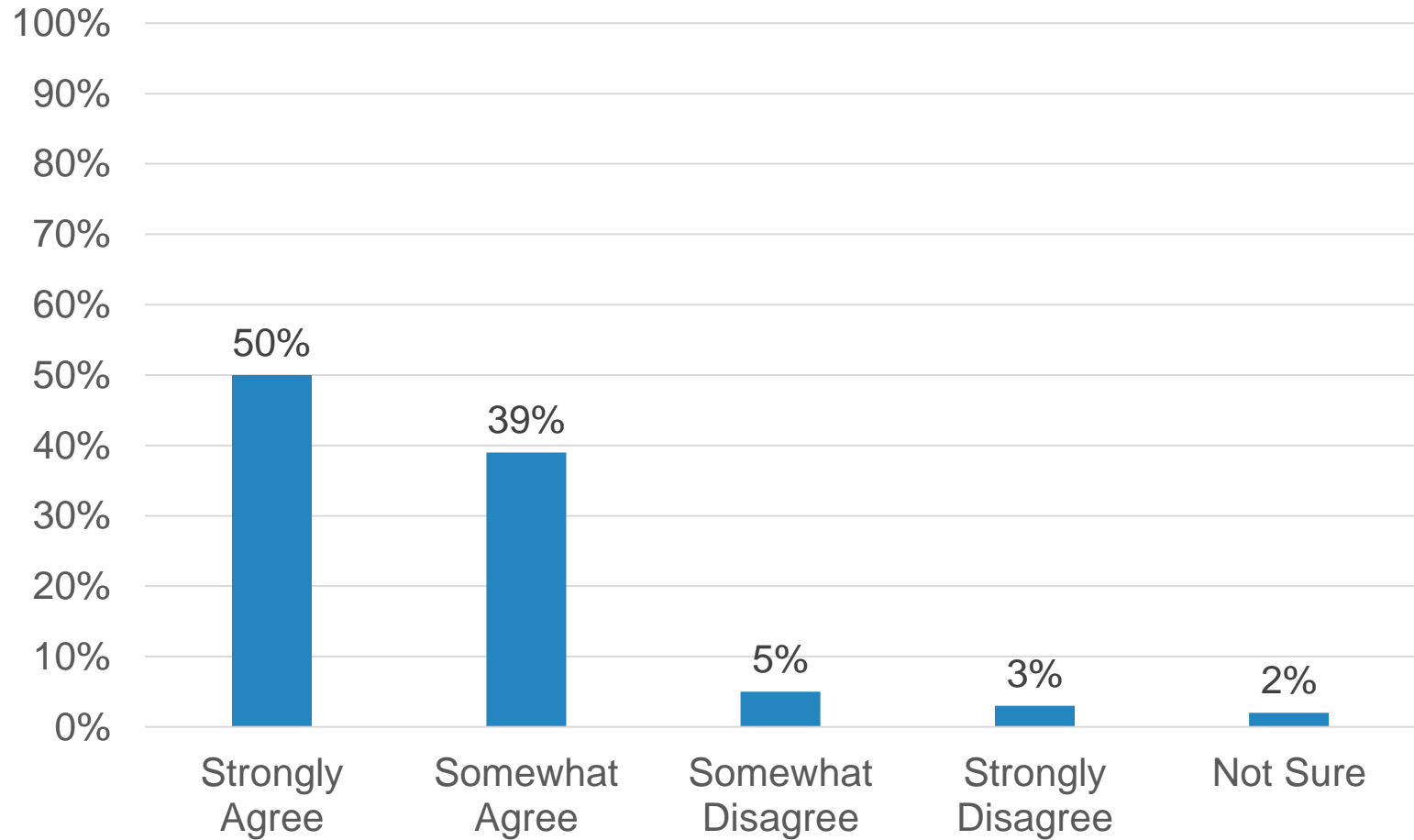

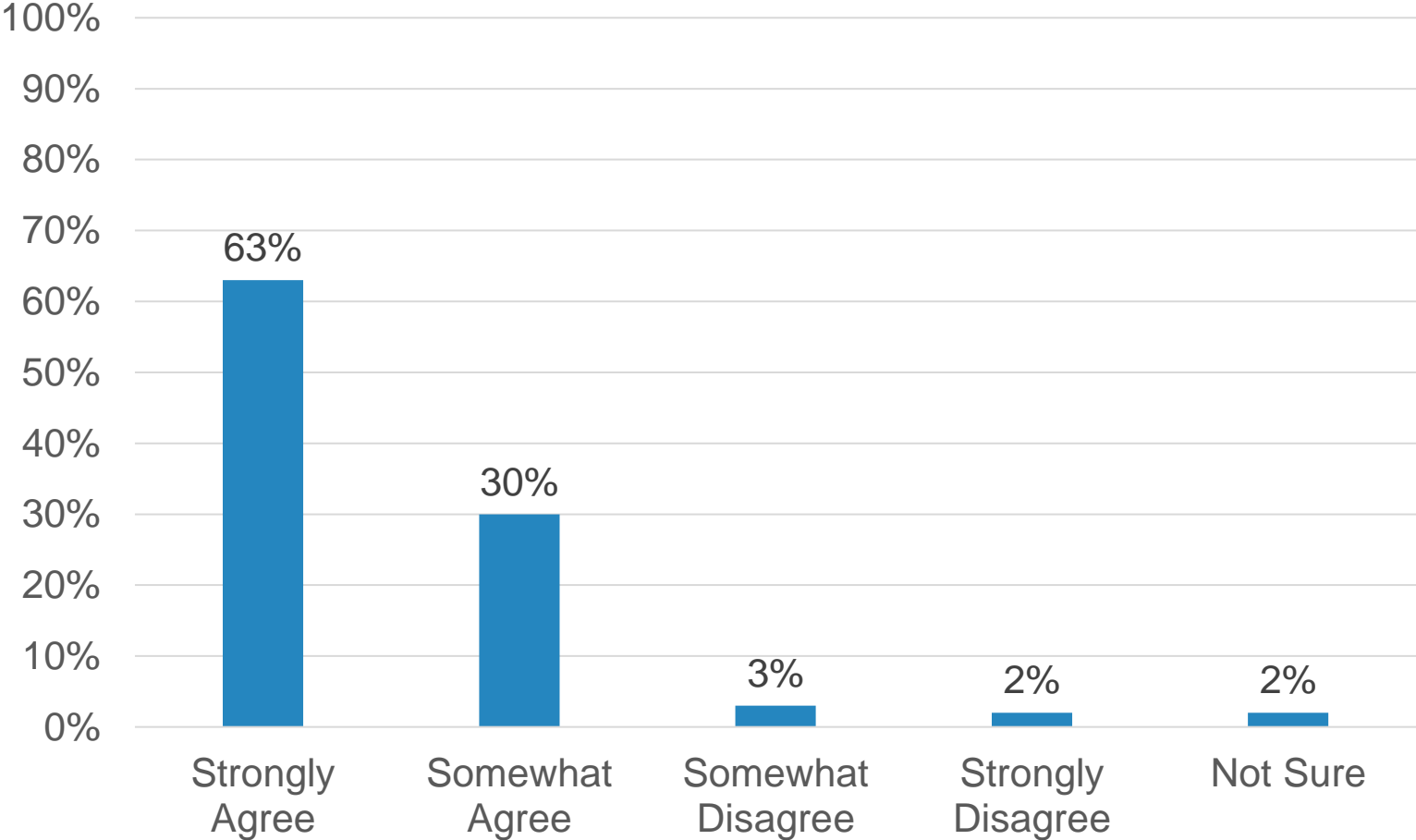

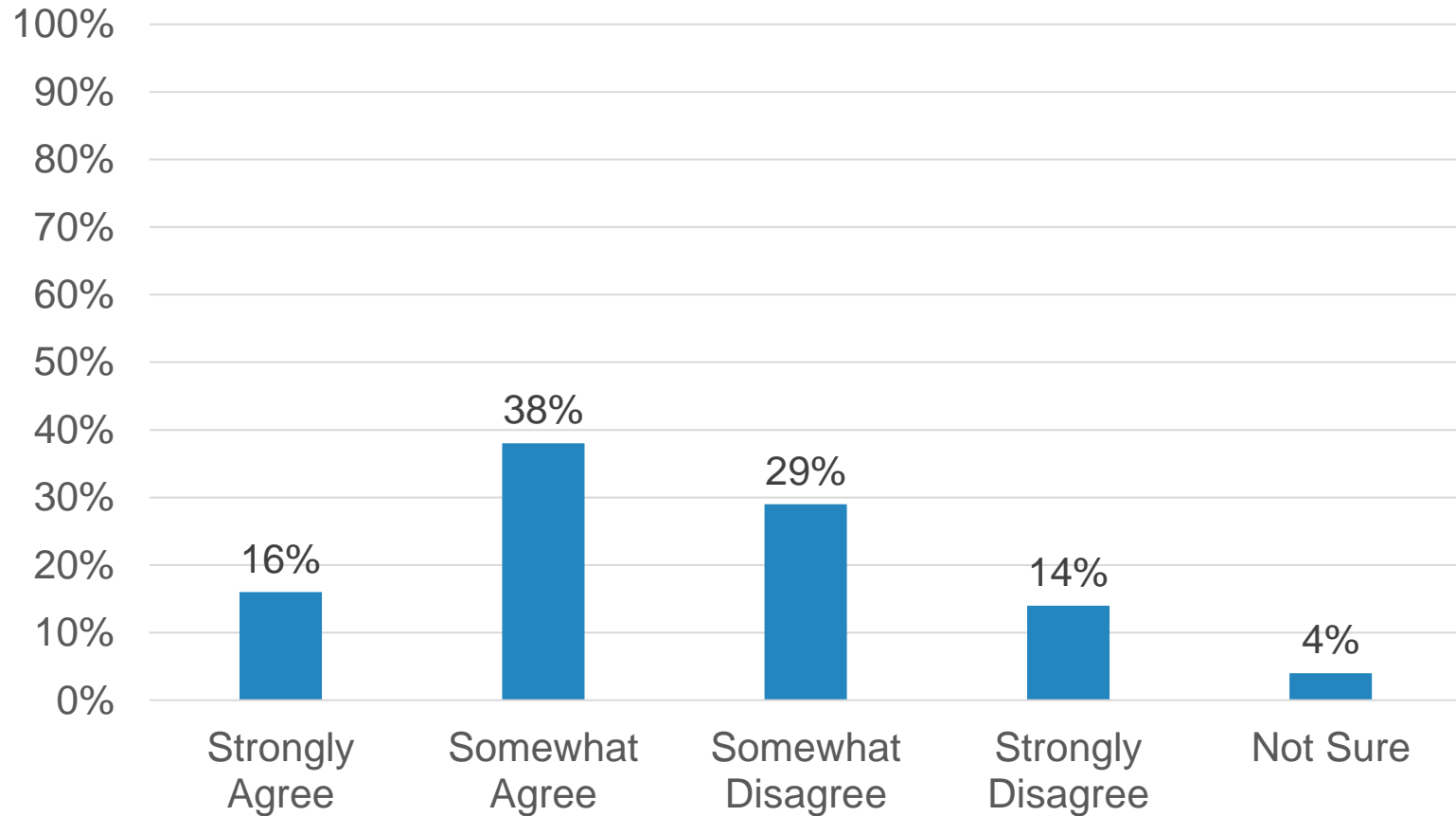

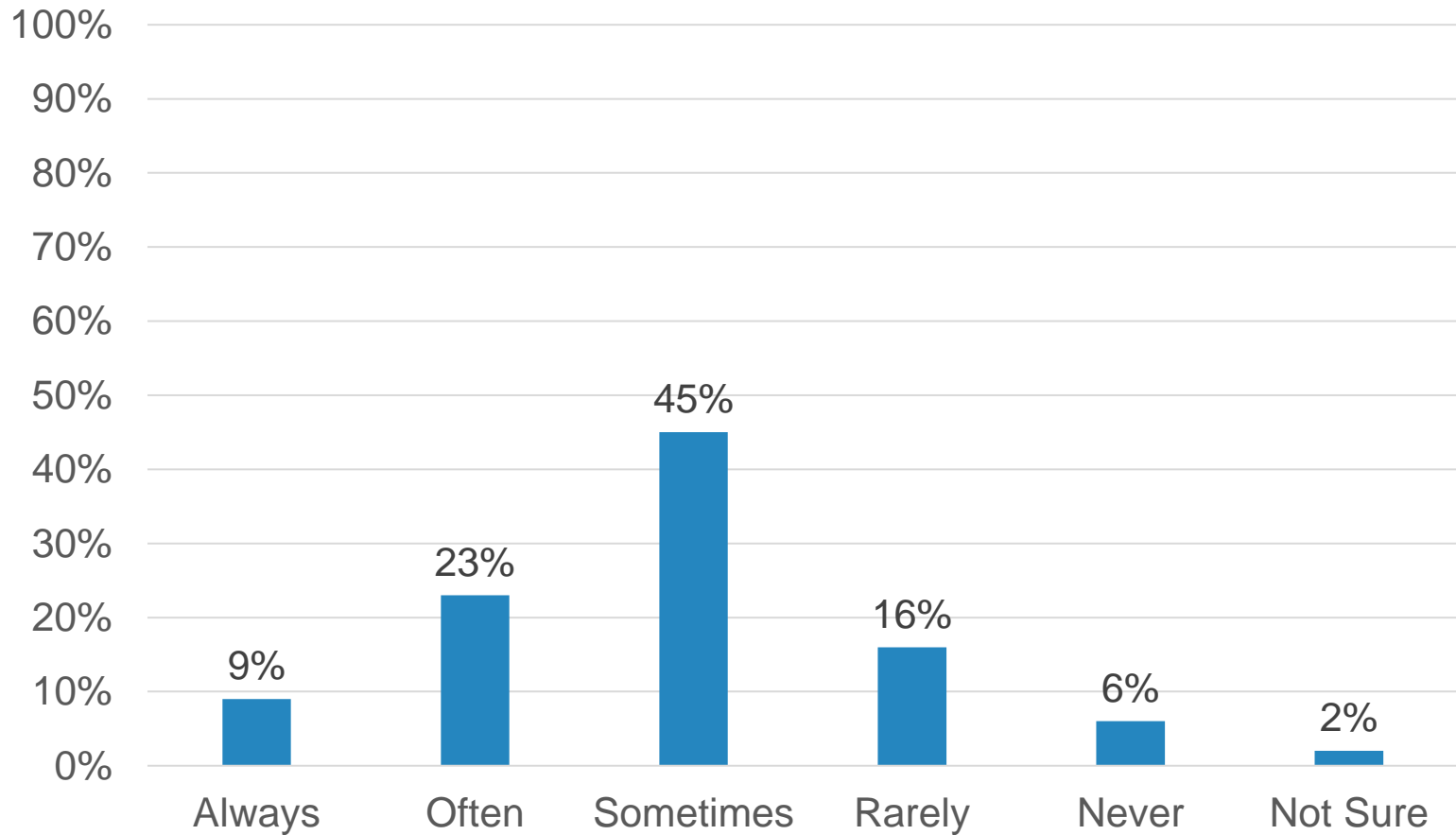

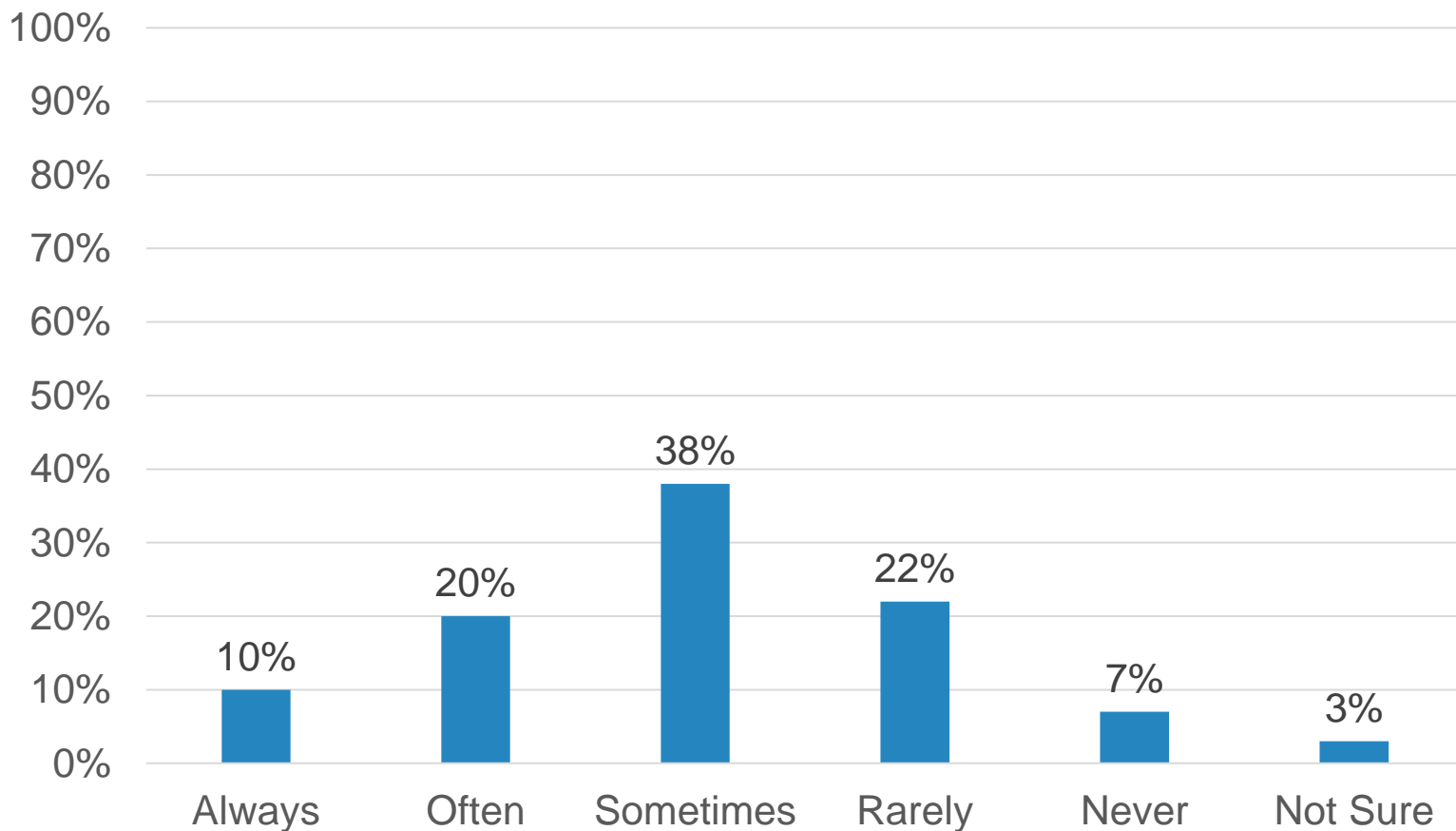

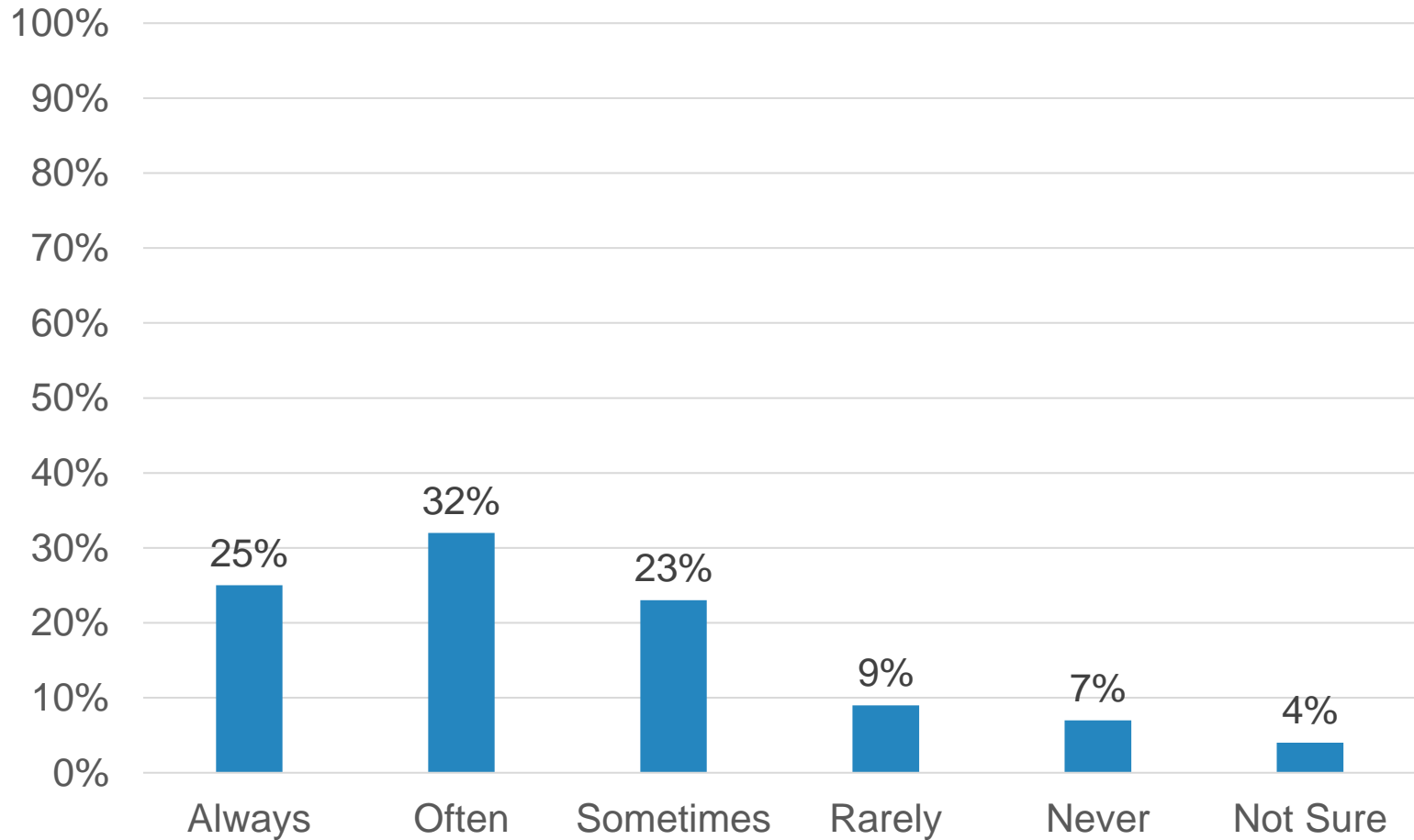

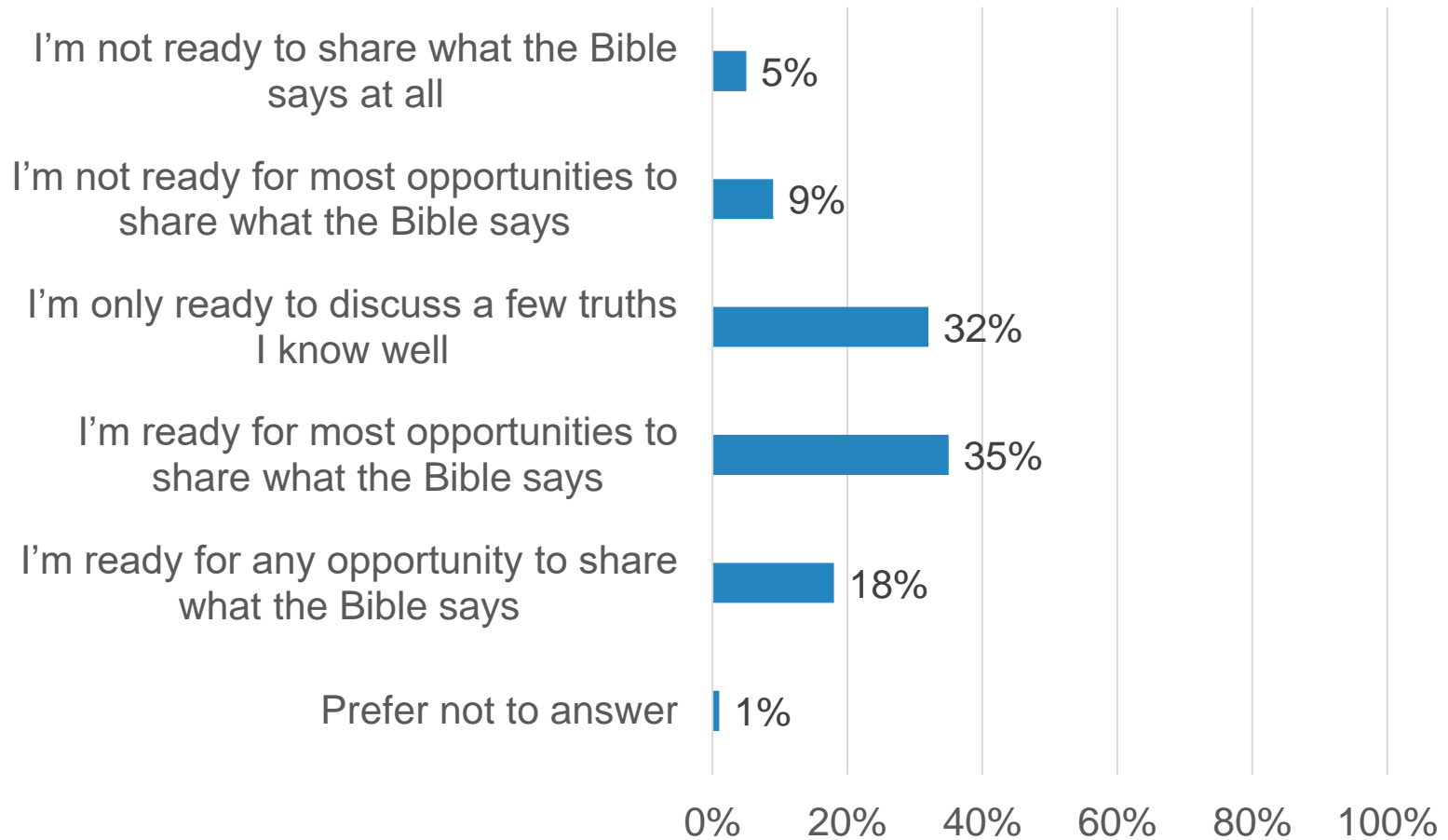

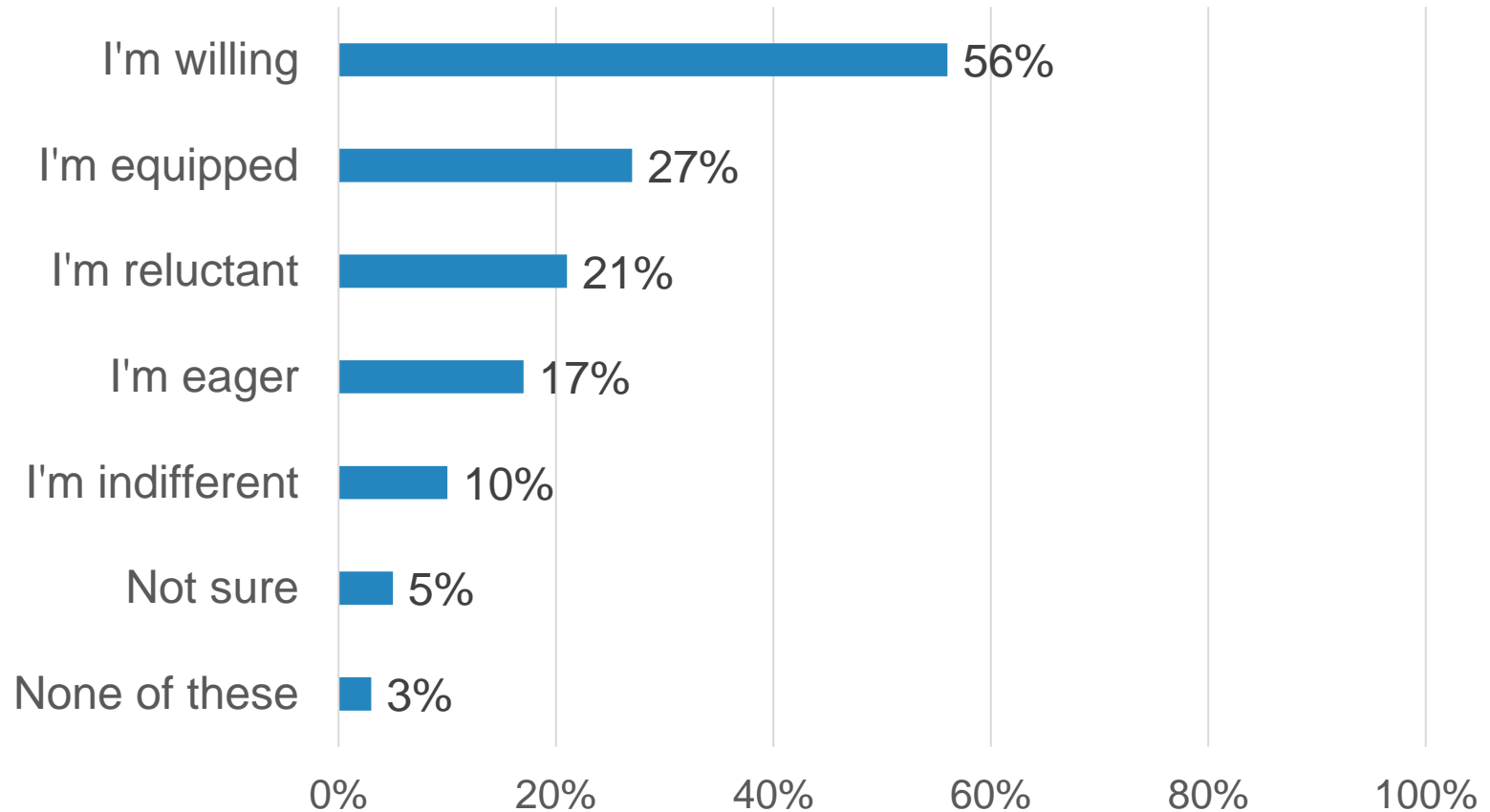

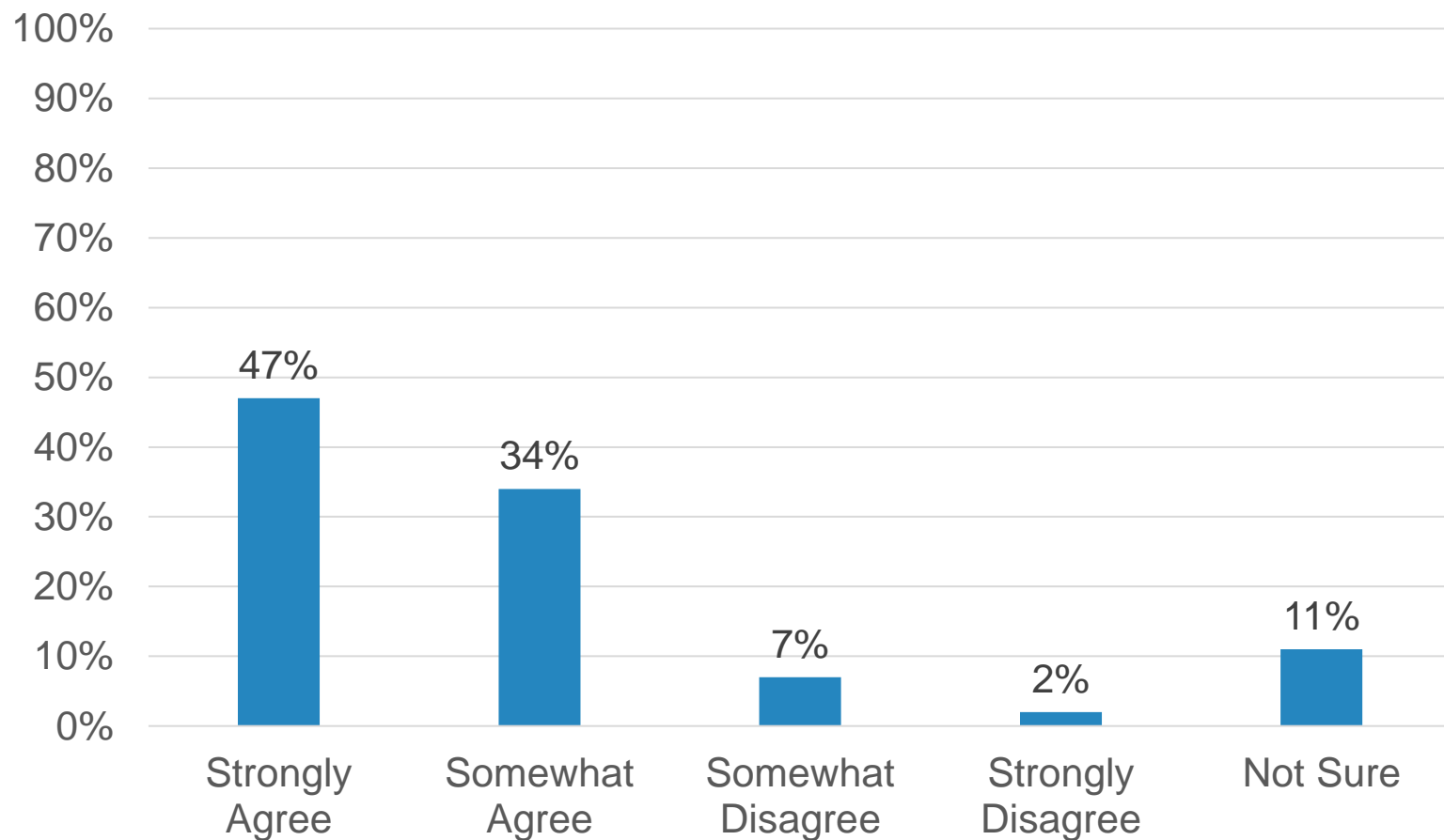

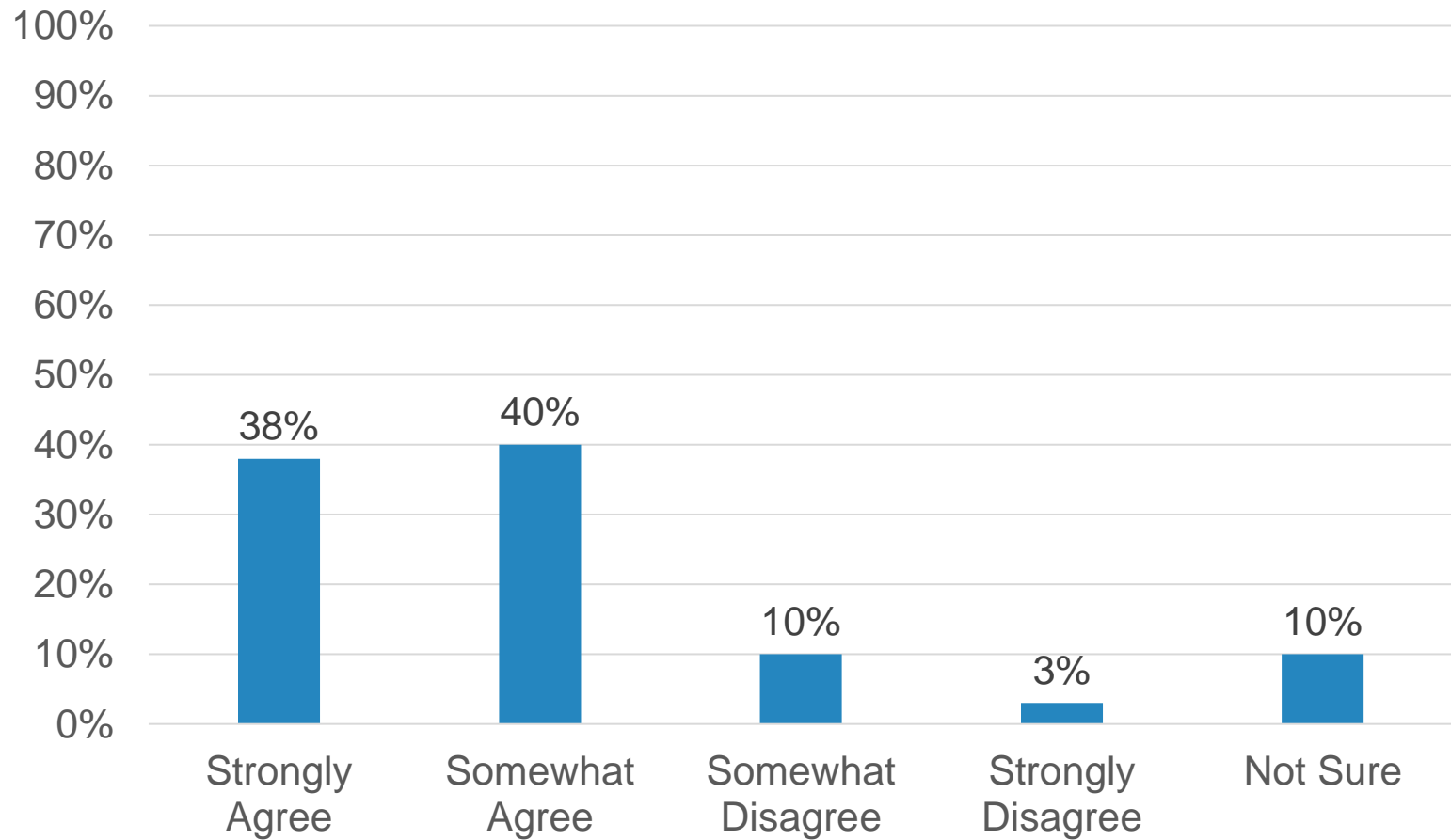

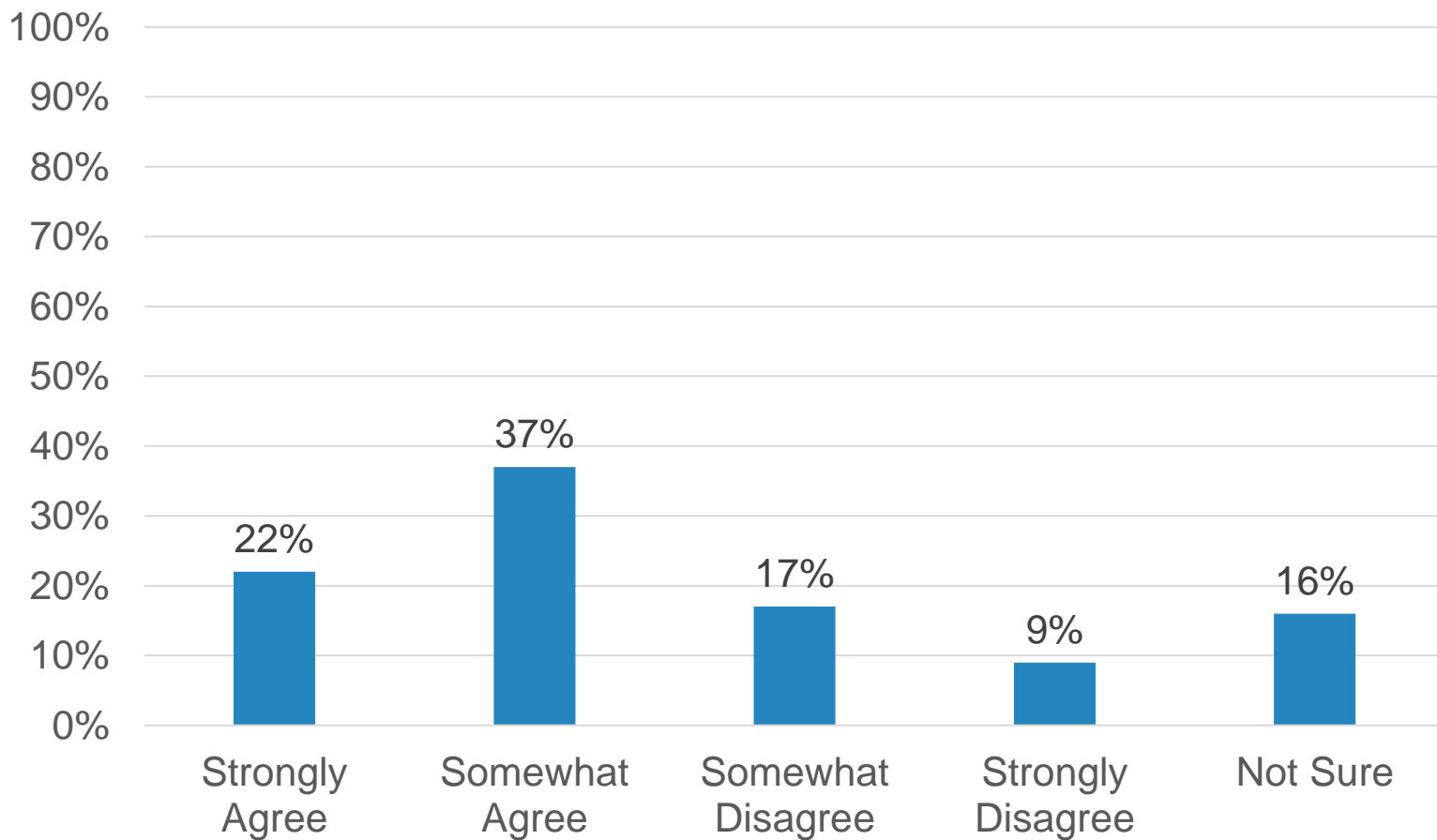

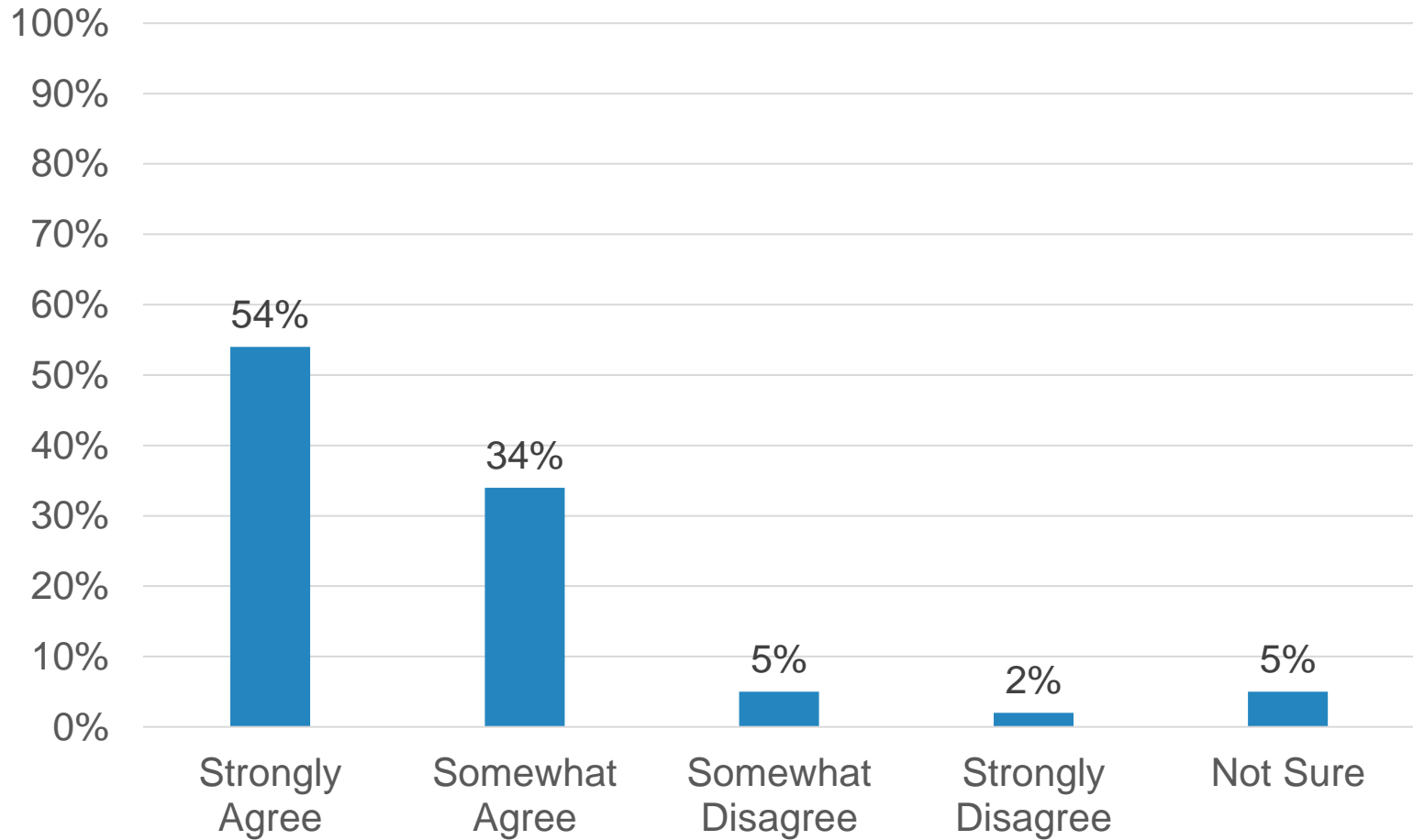

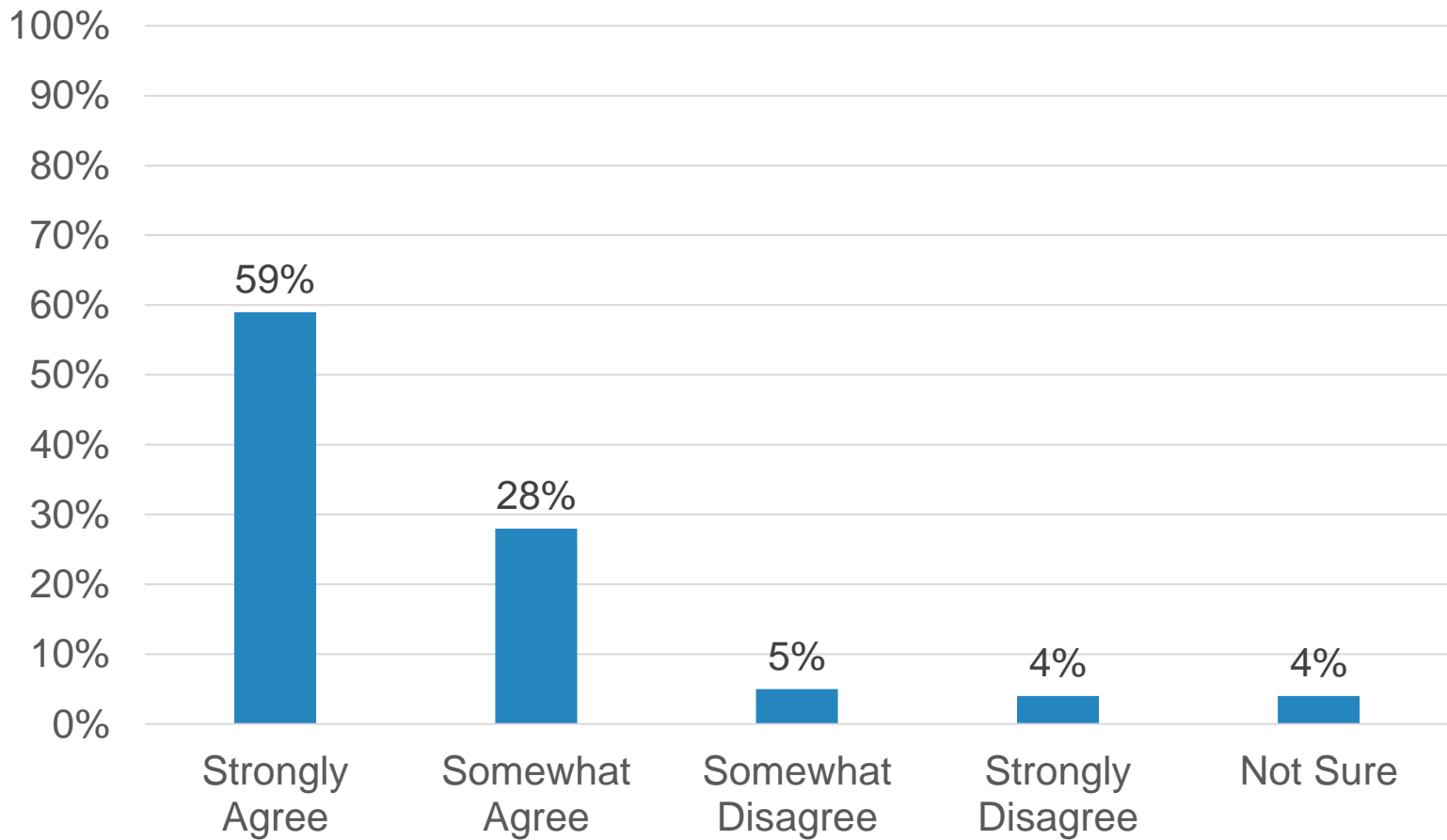

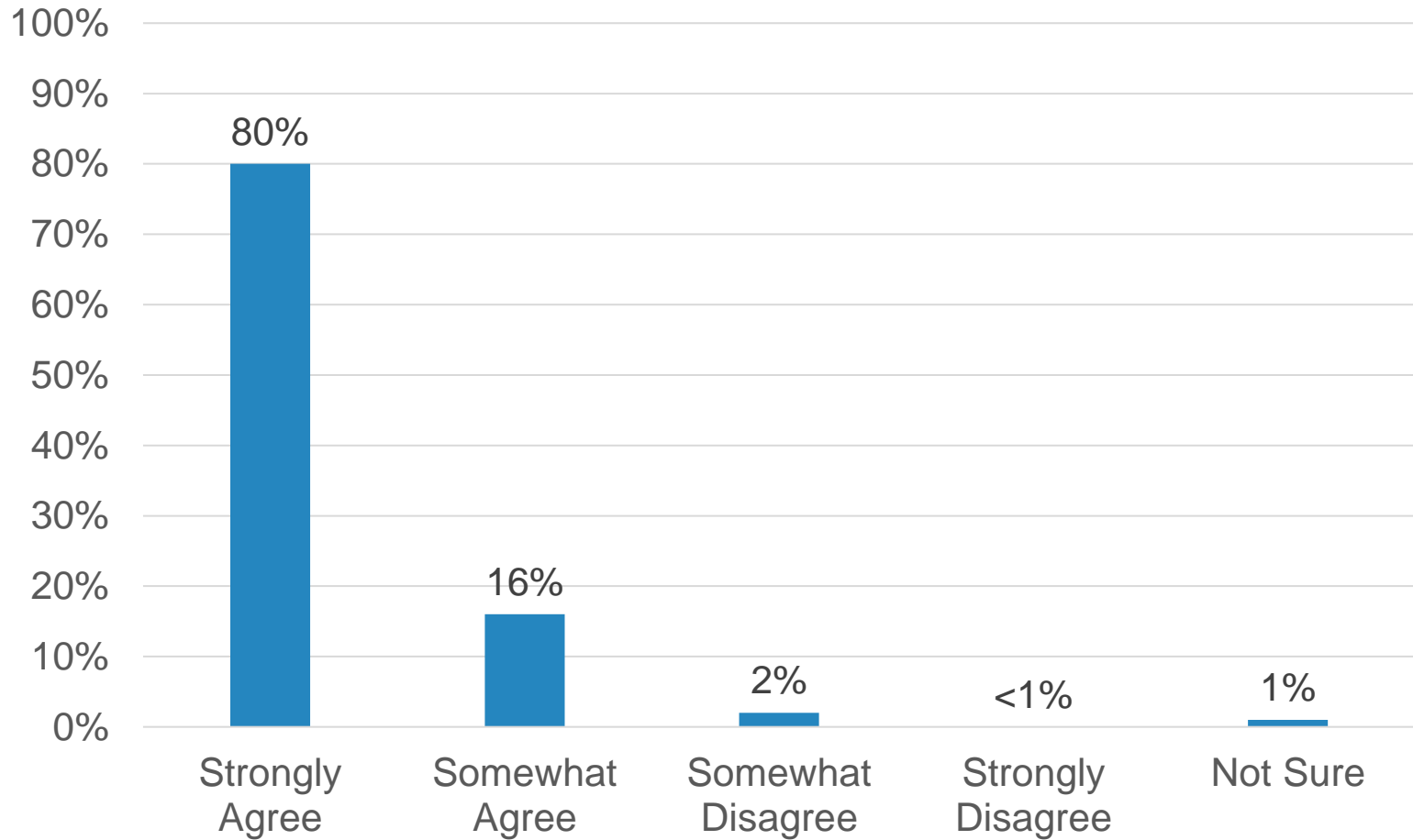

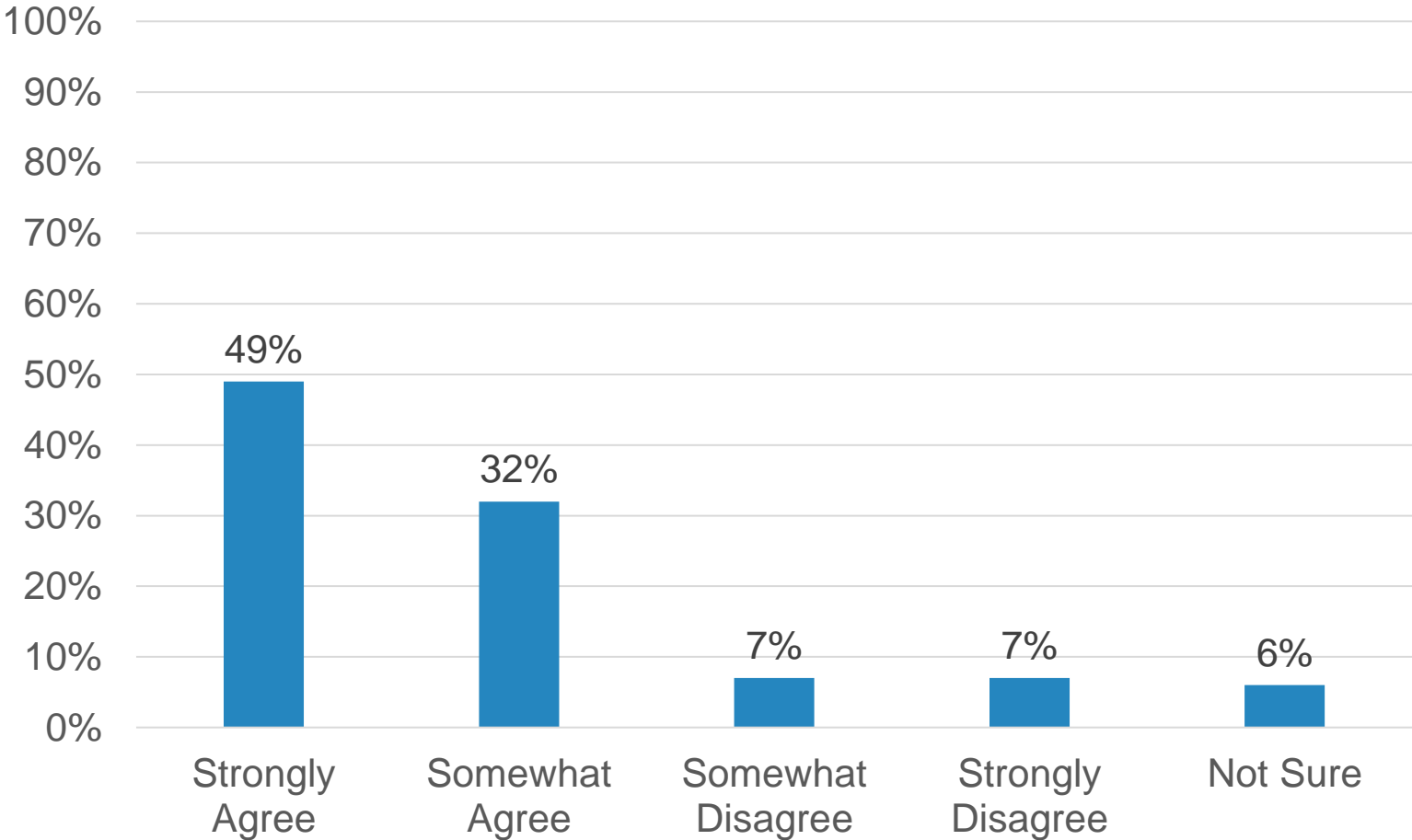

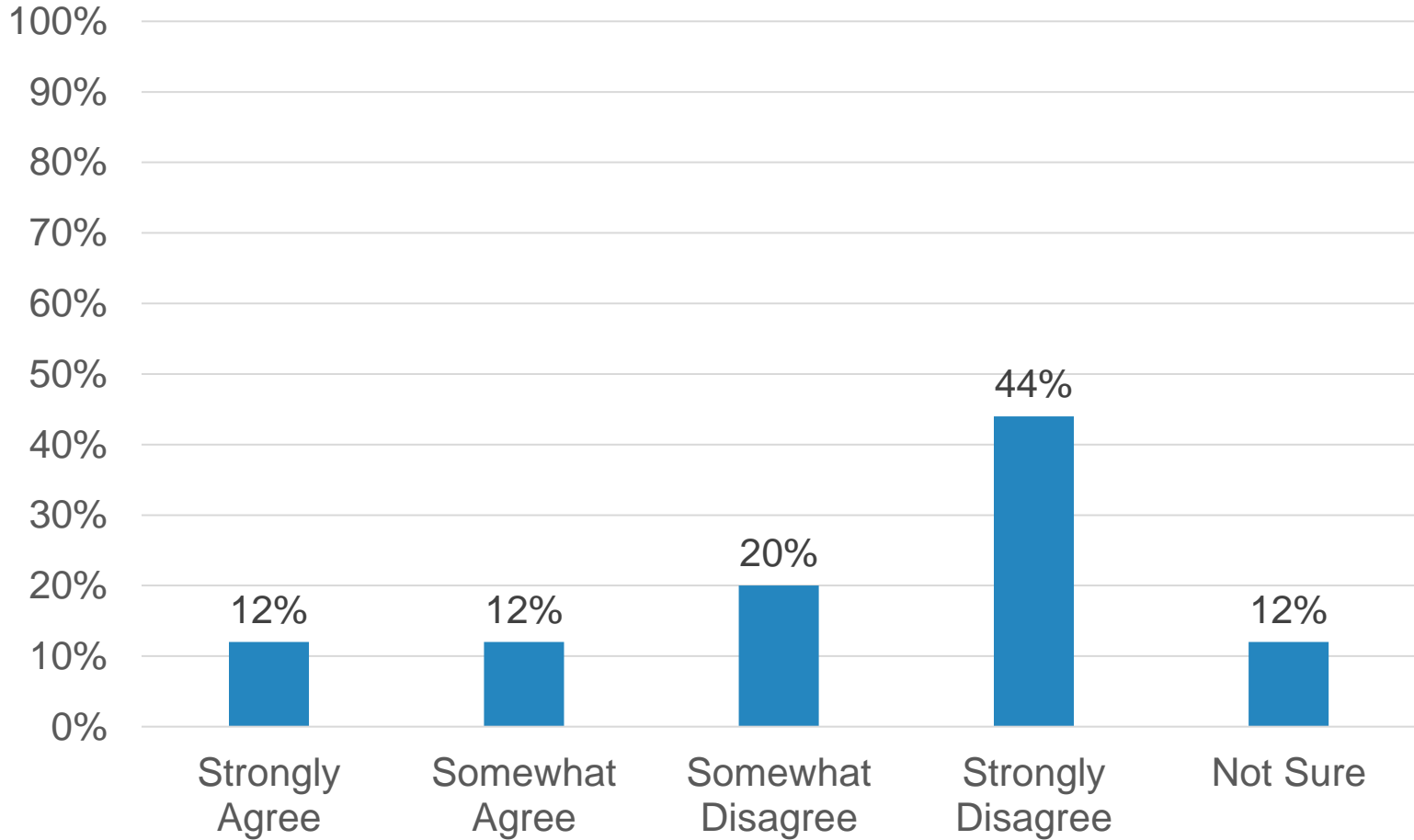

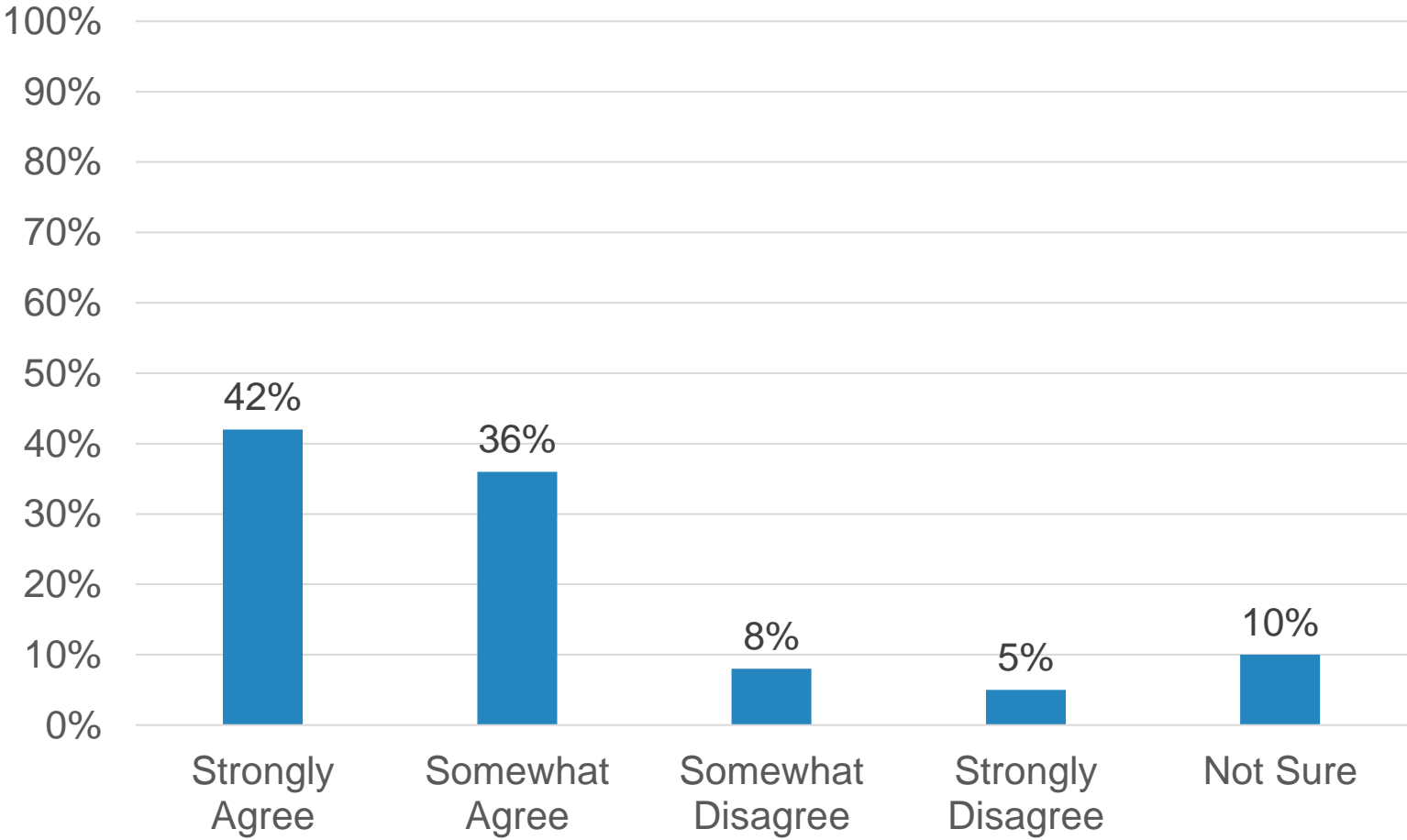

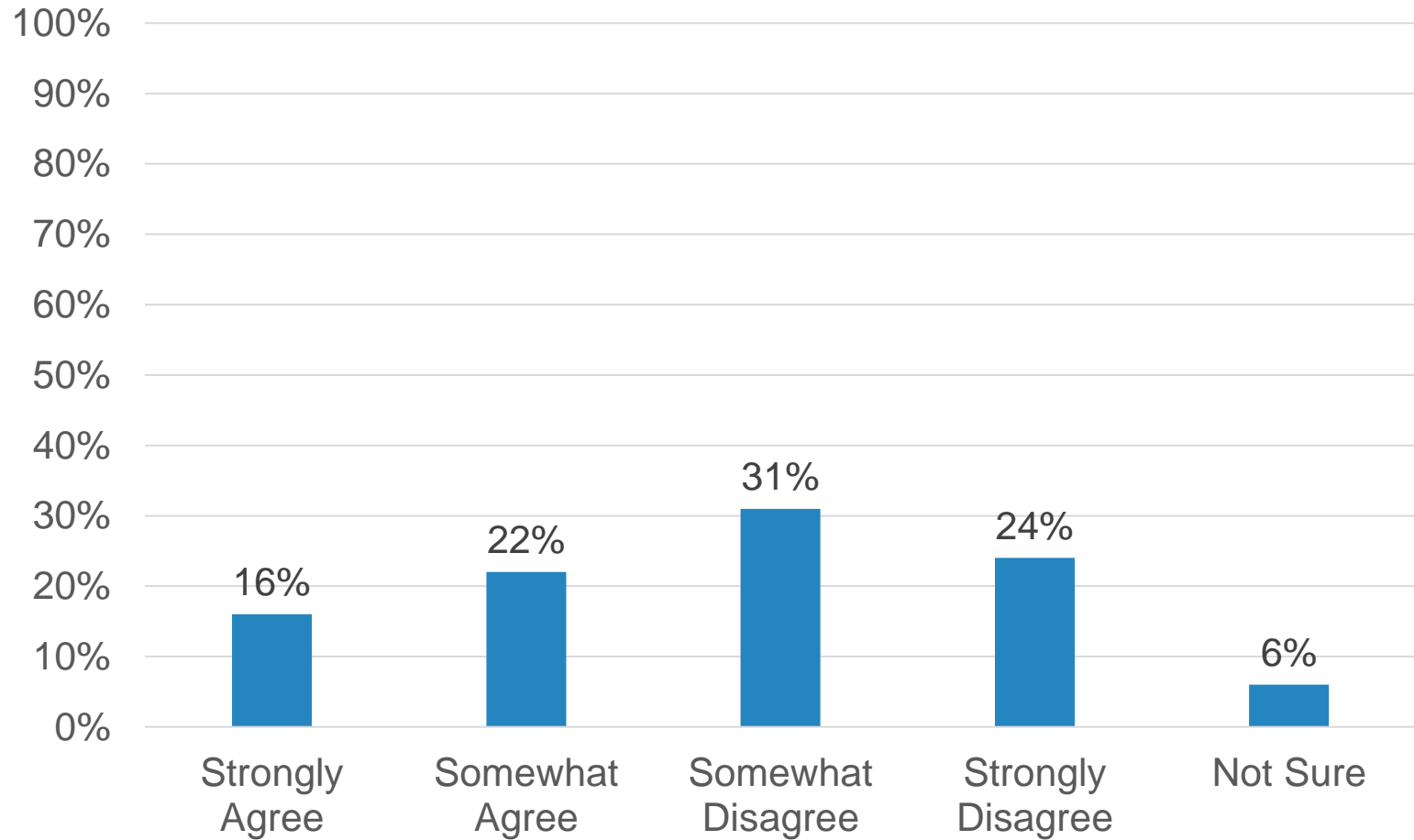

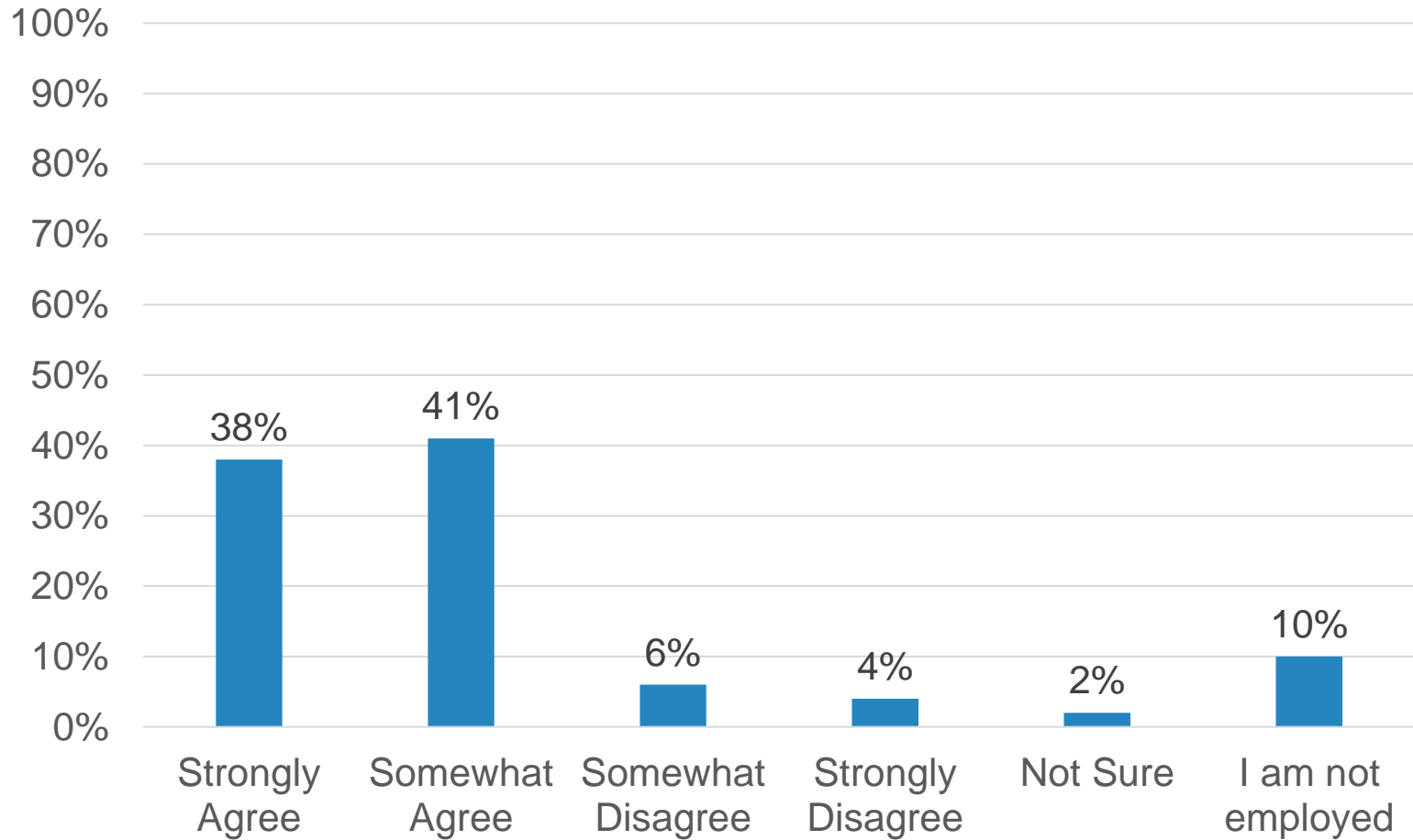

- Those in the South (70%) and West (76%) are more likely to Disagree than those in the Northeast (60%)
- Those age 50-64 (75%) and 65+ (75%) are more likely to Disagree than those 18-34 (60%) and 35-49 (65%)
- African Americans (30%) are more likely to Agree than Whites (22%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (81%) are more likely to Disagree than those who are High School Graduates or less (65%) or with some college (70%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week (75%) are more likely to Disagree than those who attend several times a year (62%) and rarely/never attend (59%)
- Those who read the Bible daily are the most likely to Disagree (78%)

- Those who read the Bible daily are the most likely to Disagree (88%)

- Those in the Midwest (56%) and South (56%) are more likely to Agree than those in the Northeast (40%)
- Those age 65+ (59%) are more likely to Agree than those 50-64 (48%)

- Those with a Graduate Degree (52%) are more likely to Disagree than those who are High School Graduates or less (40%)

- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week (13%) are more likely to select “Always” than those who attend once or twice a month (3%) and rarely/never attend (5%)

- Those with a Graduate Degree (41%) are more likely to select “Often” than those who are High School Graduates or less (28%)

- African Americans (26%) are more likely to select “I’m ready for any opportunity to share what the Bible says” than Whites (15%)
- Whites (37%) are more likely to select “I’m ready for most opportunities to share what the Bible says” than African Americans (26%)
- Those with some college (38%) or a Graduate Degree (41%) are more likely to select “I’m ready for most opportunities to share what the Bible says” than those who are High School Graduates or less (29%)
- Those who attend a worship service once/twice a month (41%), several times a year (40%), and rarely/never (37%) are more likely to select “I’m only ready to discuss a few truths I know well” than those who attend at least once a week (27%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week (40%) are more likely to select “I’m ready for most opportunities to share what the Bible says” than those who rarely/never attend (23%)

- African Americans (32%) and Other Ethnicities (38%) are more likely to select than Whites (25%)
- Those with a Bachelor’s Degree (32%) or a Graduate Degree (33%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (23%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week (33%) are more likely to select than those who attend several times a year (14%) and rarely/never attend (19%)
- Those who read the Bible daily are the most likely to select (36%)

- Those in the West are the least likely to select (11%)
- Those age 18-34 (23%) and 35-49 (23%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (15%) and 65+ (12%)

- Those age 18-34 (59%) and 50-64 (59%) are more likely to select than those 35-49 (48%)

- Those who read the Bible daily (63%) and several times a week/once a week (61%) are more likely to select than those who read once a month/several times a year (48%) and rarely/never read (37%)

I'm reluctant

- Whites (22%) and African Americans (22%) are more likely to select than Hispanics (8%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (29%) or a Graduate Degree (28%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (18%) or with some college (15%)
- Those who rarely/never read the Bible are the most likely to select (32%)

- Those age 18-34 (19%) and 35-49 (15%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (5%) and 65+ (5%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week are the least likely to select (7%)
- Those who read the Bible once a month/several times a year (17%) and rarely/never read (15%) are more likely to select than those who read daily (5%) and several times a week/once a week (9%)

- Those who rarely/never attend a worship service are the least likely to Agree (59%)
- Those who rarely/never read the Bible are the least likely to Agree (63%)

- Those with a Graduate Degree (23%) are more likely to Disagree than those who are High School Graduates or less (11%) or with some college (9%)
- Those who rarely/never attend a worship service are the least likely to Agree (53%)
- Those who rarely/never read the Bible (20%) are more likely to Disagree than those who read daily (10%) and read several times a week/once a week (12%)

- Those in the Midwest (61%) and South (61%) are more likely to Agree than those in the West (47%)

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to Agree (94%)
- Those who read the Bible daily are the most likely to Agree (93%)

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to Agree (100%)
- Whites (98%) are more likely to Agree than African Americans (95%) and Other Ethnicities (88%)

- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to Agree (68%)
- Whites are the most likely to Agree (85%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (17%) or with some college (15%) are more likely to Disagree than those with a Bachelor’s Degree (5%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week (87%) and once or twice a month (82%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend several times a year (68%) and rarely/never attend (66%)
- Those who read the Bible daily are the most likely to Agree (92%)

- Whites (70%) and Hispanics (61%) are more likely to Disagree than African Americans (45%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (31%) are more likely to Agree than those with some college (18%) or a Graduate Degree (17%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week (69%) are more likely to Disagree than those who attend several times a year (50%) and rarely/never attend (56%)
- Those who read the Bible several times a week/once a week (26%), once a month/several times a year (34%), and rarely/never read it (31%) are more likely to Agree than those who read the Bible daily (16%)
- Those who read the Bible daily are the most likely to Disagree (76%)

- Those age 65+ (84%) are more likely to Agree than those 35-49 (71%)
- Those with a Bachelor’s Degree (84%) or a Graduate Degree (87%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (75%) or with some college (75%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week (82%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend several times a year (68%) and rarely/never attend (69%)
- Those who read the Bible daily (86%) and several times a week/once a week (82%) are more likely to Agree than those who read once a month/several times a year (67%) and rarely/never read (63%)

“As long as you work hard, you don’t owe people at your job anything else.”

- Those in the Northeast (42%) and South (41%) are more likely to Agree than those in the West (30%)
- Those age 18-34 are the most likely to Agree (57%)
- Males are more likely to Agree than females (44% v. 33%)
- African Americans are the most likely to Agree (60%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the most likely to Agree (48%)
- Those who attend a worship service once or twice a month (44%) and rarely/never attend (48%) are more likely to Agree than those who attend at least once a week (34%)
- Those who rarely/never read the Bible are the most likely to Agree (52%)

“I have an obligation to care for the people I work with.”

- Whites (83%) are more likely to Agree than African Americans (70%) and Hispanic/Latino (66%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to Agree (71%)
- Those who attend a worship service at least once a week are the most likely to Agree (85%)
- Those who read the Bible daily (87%) and several times a week/once a week (82%) are more likely to Agree than those who read once a month/several times a year (69%) and rarely/never read (64%)
