Pastors' Views on Persecuted Christians

A SURVEY OF AMERICAN PROTESTANT PASTORS

Methodology

- The phone survey of 1,003 Protestant pastors was conducted August 8 – September 3, 2024
- The calling list was a stratified random sample, drawn from a list of all Protestant churches. Quotas were used for church size
- Each interview was conducted with the senior pastor, minister or priest at the church
- Responses were weighted by region and church size to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,003 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error does not exceed <u>+</u>3.3% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups



Significant Differences

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among the pastor's ethnicity, age, gender, education, self-identified Evangelical or Mainline.

Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among the church's region, denomination, and attendance.

Prayed in a worship service for persecuted Christians worldwide

- Male pastors are more likely to select than females (87% v. 75%)
- Evangelical pastors are more likely to select than Mainline pastors (89% v. 79%)
- Pastors in the South (88%) and West (88%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (78%)
- Presbyterian/Reformed are the least likely to select (72%)

Encouraged your congregation to pray for persecuted Christians worldwide

- Male pastors are more likely to select than females (89% v. 75%)
- Pastors with a Bachelor's Degree (92%) are more likely to select than those with a Master's Degree (85%) or a Doctoral Degree (80%)
- Evangelical pastors are more likely to select than Mainline pastors (92% v. 80%)
- Pastors in the South (89%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (80%)
- Baptists (90%) and Pentecostals (96%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (84%) and Presbyterian/Reformed (75%)

Talked about modern persecuted Christians worldwide in a sermon

- Male pastors are more likely to select than females (71% v. 41%)
- Pastors with a Master's Degree are the least likely to select (59%)
- Evangelical pastors are more likely to select than Mainline pastors (75% v. 53%)
- Baptists (74%), Pentecostals (82%), Christian/Church of Christ (70%), and Non-denominational (72%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (56%) and Presbyterian/Reformed (47%)
- Pastors at churches with attendance 100-249 (75%) and 250+ (74%) are more likely to select than those at churches with attendance of 0-49 (59%)

Showed a video in worship about persecuted Christians worldwide

- Male pastors are more likely to select than females (18% v. 8%)
- Evangelical pastors are more likely to select than Mainline pastors (22% v. 9%)
- Lutherans are the least likely to select (4%)
- Pastors at churches with attendance 0-49 are the least likely to select (10%)

Had an event to bring awareness of persecuted Christians worldwide

- Pastors age 65+ (23%) are more likely to select than pastors age 18-44 (14%) and 55-64 (13%)
- Male pastors are more likely to select than females (18% v. 12%)
- Pastors of Other Ethnicities are the most likely to select (25%)
- Non-denominational (27%) are more likely to select than Baptists (15%), Lutherans (16%), Methodists (11%), and Christian/Church of Christ (12%)

Handed out information about persecuted Christians worldwide

- Pastors age 65+ (37%) are more likely to select than pastors age 18-44 (25%)
- Male pastors are more likely to select than females (34% v. 16%)
- Evangelical pastors are more likely to select than Evangelical pastors (36% v. 24%)
- Baptists (33%) and Non-denominational (39%) are more likely to select than Presbyterian/Reformed (23%) and Christian/Church of Christ (20%)
