### Protestant Churchgoer Views On Christmas Giving


A SURVEY OF 1,200 AMERICAN PROTESTANT CHURCHGOERS


### Methodology


- The online survey of 1,200 American Protestant churchgoers was conducted September 2-7, 2025, using a national pre-recruited panel
- Respondents were screened to include those who identified as Protestant/non-denominational and attend religious services at least once a month
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance gender, age, region, ethnicity, education, and religion to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,200 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed <u>+</u>3.2% This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups

### **Definitions**

- Evangelical Beliefs are defined using the NAE Lifeway Research Evangelical Beliefs Research Definition based on respondent beliefs
- Respondents are asked their level of agreement with four separate statements using a four-point, forced choice scale (strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree, strongly disagree).
  Those who strongly agree with all four statements are categorized as having Evangelical Beliefs
  - The Bible is the highest authority for what I believe
  - It is very important for me personally to encourage non-Christians to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior
  - Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the only sacrifice that could remove the penalty of my sin
  - Only those who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their Savior receive God's free gift of eternal salvation

### **Significant Differences**

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among gender, age, ethnicity, region, and education.

### Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among denomination, worship service attendance, evangelical beliefs, and church size.

#### My church's capital or building campaign

- Males are more likely to select than females (18% v. 10%)
- African Americans (21%) are more likely to select than Whites (12%)
- Those in the Midwest are the least likely to select (9%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (19%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (10%)
- Presbyterian/Reformed (22%) are more likely to select than Baptists (13%) and Non-denominational (11%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (17%) and 500 or more (19%) are more likely to select than churches of 50-99 (11%)

#### My church's missions offering

- Males are more likely to select than females (43% v. 32%)
- Those age 18-29 (42%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (33%)
- Those in the South (40%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (33%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (44%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (35%)
- Baptists (44%) and Presbyterian/Reformed (45%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (21%) and Non-denominational (27%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (40%), 250-499 (46%), and 500 or more (42%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (27%) and 50-99 (32%)

#### My church's efforts to help those in need

- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (54%) are more likely to select than those with some college (45%) or a Graduate Degree (45%)
- Baptists (54%) and Methodists (51%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (36%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (52% v. 45%)

#### An extra financial gift to my church's general fund

- Males are more likely to select than females (31% v. 21%)
- Those age 30-49 (30%) are more likely to select than those 18-29 (20%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (35%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (21%) or with some college (22%)
- Methodists (34%) are more likely to select than Baptists (25%), Presbyterian/Reformed (18%), and Non-denominational (18%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 50-99 (26%), 100-249 (29%), and 500 or more (29%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (17%)

#### A national Christian ministry

- Those in the South (17%) and West (16%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (9%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (21%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (12%) or with some college (11%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (19%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (10%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (17% v. 12%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250-499 (21%) and 500 or more (21%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (9%) and 50-99 (11%)

#### A local Christian ministry

- Those age 18-29 (26%) and 30-49 (27%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (16%) and 65+ (17%)
- Those in the South (22%) and West (24%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (15%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (24%) or a Graduate Degree (28%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (18%) or with some college (18%)
- Presbyterian/Reformed (34%) are more likely to select than Baptists (21%), Lutherans (11%), and Non-denominational (19%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (24%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (16%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (23% v. 18%)

#### Directly to a person or family I know is in need

- Those age 18-29 (35%) and 30-49 (35%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (26%) and 65+ (23%)
- African Americans (34%) and Hispanics (40%) are more likely to select than Whites (26%)
- Those with some college (34%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (26%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250-499 (34%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (25%)
- Baptists (33%) and Non-denominational (31%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (13%)

#### Other non-profit that isn't a Christian organization

- Females are more likely to select than males (17% v. 13%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to select (10%)
- Methodists (21%) are more likely to select than Baptists (13%) and Presbyterian/Reformed (10%)

#### I typically don't make any additional donations at Christmastime

- Those age 65+ (16%) are more likely to select than those 30-49 (10%)
- Those in the Midwest (17%) are more likely to select than those in the South (10%)
- Lutherans (19%) and Non-denominational (21%) are more likely to select than Baptists (9%)
- Those at a church with attendance of less than 50 (18%) and 50-99 (15%) are more likely to select than churches of 100-249 (9%)

#### **Shoebox item for Operation Christmas Child**

- Whites (27%) and Other Ethnicities (27%) are more likely to select than African Americans (15%)
- Those in the South (28%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (20%) and West (20%)
- Baptists (31%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (14%) and Nondenominational (22%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (30%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 to 3 times a month (19%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (29% v. 20%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (29%) and 500 or more (32%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (17%) and 50-99 (20%)

#### **Angel tree gifts for Prison Fellowship**

- Those age 65+ are the least likely to select (7%)
- Those in the South (15%) and West (15%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (9%)
- Baptists (13%), Methodists (15%), and Christian/Church of Christ (23%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (6%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 50-99 (14%), 250-499 (18%), and 500 or more (16%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (8%)

#### Items collected by my church to help others

- Males are more likely to select than females (44% v. 38%)
- Those age 30-49 (46%) are more likely to select than those 18-29 (36%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (46%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (37%)
- Baptists (43%) are more likely to select than Non-denominational (32%)

#### Food for a local food bank

- Those age 30-49 (52%) are more likely to select than those 65+ (40%)
- Methodists (57%) and Presbyterian/Reformed (57%) are more likely to select than Baptists (43%), Lutherans (37%), and Non-denominational (42%)
- Those without evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those with evangelical beliefs (51% v. 41%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 500 or more are the least likely to select (32%)

#### Items collected by a non-profit that is not a Christian organization

- Those age 18-29 (19%) and 30-49 (23%) are more likely to select than those 65+ (11%)
- African Americans (22%) are more likely to select than Whites (15%)
- Those with some college (18%) or a Bachelor's Degree (20%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (12%)
- Methodists (22%) are more likely to select than Presbyterian/Reformed (9%) and Non-denominational (13%)

#### Items collected by a local Christian ministry

- Males are more likely to select than females (21% v. 16%)
- Those age 18-29 (27%) and 30-49 (25%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (13%) and 65+ (14%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (22%) are more likely to select than those with some college (15%)
- Those at a church with attendance of less than 50 are the least likely to select (9%)

#### Items collected by a national Christian ministry

- Those age 18-29 (15%) and 30-49 (20%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (7%) and 65+ (7%)
- Hispanics (19%) and Other Ethnicities (19%) are more likely to select than Whites (10%) and African Americans (10%)
- Those in the Midwest are the least likely to select (7%)
- Baptists (12%), Methodists (12%), Presbyterian/Reformed (12%), and Nondenominational (8%) are more likely to select than Lutherans (2%)

#### I didn't donate items at Christmastime last year

- Those age 50-64 (21%) and 65+ (25%) are more likely to select than those 18-29 (14%) and 30-49 (15%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (22%) or with some college (%) are more likely to select than those with a Bachelor's Degree (15%)
- Non-denominational (29%) are more likely to select than Baptists (18%), Methodists (11%), Presbyterian/Reformed (17%), and Christian/Church of Christ (9%)
