

State of Ministry to Men Churchgoer Report

REPORT OF STATISTICALLY SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES IN RESPONSES
FOR 12 SUBGROUPS OF AMERICAN EVANGELICAL AND BLACK PROTESTANT
MALE CHURCHGOERS

Lifeway[®] Research

Methodology

- The online survey of 1,000 American Evangelical and Black Protestant male churchgoers was conducted June 12 - July 6, 2026, using a national pre-recruited panel
- Respondents were screened to include those whose church's affiliation or denomination/group preference is an Evangelical or Black Protestant group, and attend religious services at a church in a typical a month
- Quotas and slight weights were used to balance gender, age, region, ethnicity, education, and religion to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,000 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error from the panel does not exceed $\pm 3.5\%$ This margin of error accounts for the effect of weighting
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups

Definitions

- **Evangelical Beliefs** are defined using the NAE Lifeway Research Evangelical Beliefs Research Definition based on respondent beliefs
- Respondents are asked their level of agreement with four separate statements using a four-point, forced choice scale (strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree, strongly disagree). Those who strongly agree with all four statements are categorized as having Evangelical Beliefs
 - The Bible is the highest authority for what I believe
 - It is very important for me personally to encourage non-Christians to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior
 - Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the only sacrifice that could remove the penalty of my sin
 - Only those who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their Savior receive God's free gift of eternal salvation

Biology

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (26%)
- Whites are the most likely to select (22%)
- Those with a Bachelor’s Degree (22%) or a Graduate Degree (25%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (15%)
- Those who attend a worship service attend 1 time a month (30%) are more likely to select than those who 3 times (15%) or 4 or more (19%) times a month

Protector

- Those age 18-34 (54%) and 35-49 (55%) are more likely to select than those 50-64 (43%) and 65+ (34%)
- Hispanics (56%) are more likely to select than Whites (43%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (48%) are more likely to select than those with a Graduate Degree (38%)
- Divorced (52%) are more likely to select than Widowed (32%)
- Those with children under 18 living at home are more likely to select than those without children under 18 living at home (53% v. 43%)

Moral character

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (69%)

- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (61%) are more likely to select than those who attend 3 times a month (51%)
- Those who attend small groups zero (61%) or 4 or more times (63%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (51%)

- Those age 50-64 (66%) and 65+ (67%) are more likely to select than those 35-49 (55%)

- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (69%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (75%)

Honesty

- Those age 18-34 (61%) and 65+ (61%) are more likely to select than those 35-49 (50%)
- Whites (61%) are more likely to select than African Americans (47%)

- Those without children under 18 living at home are more likely to select than those with children under 18 living at home (60% v. 49%)

Age (older than a boy)

- Those age 18-34 (22%) are more likely to select than those 35-49 (13%) and 50-64 (12%)

- Those in the Northeast are the most likely to select (40%)

- African Americans are the most likely to select (56%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Black Protestant are more likely to select than those whose tradition is Evangelical (51% v. 38%)
- Those who attend small groups 1 time (44%), 2 times (43%), or 3 times (46%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend zero times month (31%)
- Those with children under 18 living at home are more likely to select than those without children under 18 living at home (50% v. 35%)

Responsible

- Those in the Midwest (67%) are more likely to select than those in the West (53%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 50-99 (64%) and 100-249 (65%) are more likely to select than churches of 250 or more (54%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month (72%) are more likely to select than those who attend 3 times a month (58%)

Relationships among men in the church are stronger

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (71%)
- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to select (39%)
- Those in the South (61%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (51%)
- Whites are the most likely to select (61%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to select (49%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more are the most likely to select (69%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Evangelical are more likely to select than those whose tradition is Black Protestant (59% v. 48%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (63% v. 49%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (61%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (38%)

Relationships among men in the church are stronger *continued*

- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (65%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a (53%) or 2 times month (48%)
- Married (63%), Divorced (72%), and Widowed (76%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (43%)
- Those without children under 18 living at home are more likely to select than those with children under 18 living at home (61% v. 47%)

Relationships across age groups are stronger

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (57%)
- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to select (28%)
- Whites (49%) are more likely to select than Hispanics (36%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to select (36%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more (51%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (37%) and 50-99 (39%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (51% v. 39%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month are the least likely to select (19%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (53%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time (35%) or 3 times (38%) a month
- Those at churches with an organized men’s ministry (49%) are more likely to select than those at churches with activities for men but nothing formal (38%)
- Married (54%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (35%) and Divorced (42%)

Relationships among men with different backgrounds are stronger

- Those age 50-64 (51%) and 65+ (55%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (36%)
- African Americans are the least likely to select (37%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (58%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (43%) or with some college (46%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more are the most likely to select (59%)
- Those at a church with attendance of Less than 50 are the least likely to select (29%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Evangelical are more likely to select than those whose tradition is Black Protestant (50% v. 39%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (52%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time (30%) or 2 times (42%) a month
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (61%)
- Married (52%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (42%)

A safe place is provided for men to discuss their problems and struggles

- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to select (40%)
- Hispanics are the least likely to select (37%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (57%) and 250 or more (56%) are more likely to select than churches of 50-99 (46%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (61%) are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (47%), 1 time (47%), or 3 times a month (46%)
- Married (55%) and Divorced (62%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (47%)

More serving gets done within the church

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (44%)
- Whites are the most likely to select (35%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (39%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (29%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more (37%) are more likely to select than churches of 50-99 (27%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (35%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (15%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (40%) are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (27%) or 1 time (24%) a month
- Married (37%) and Divorced (36%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (25%)
- Those without children under 18 living at home are more likely to select than those with children under 18 living at home (35% v. 25%)

A forum is provided for accountability among men

- Those age 50-64 (41%) and 65+ (39%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (23%) and 35-49 (28%)
- Hispanics are the least likely to select (15%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to select (24%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more are the most likely to select (45%)
- Those whose religious tradition is Black Protestant are more likely to select than those whose tradition is Evangelical (43% v. 33%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (42%) are more likely to select than those who attend 0 times (32%), 1 time (31%), or 2 times (32%) a month
- Married (39%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (27%)

Opportunities are provided for men to be encouraged and supported

- Those age 65+ are the most likely to select (62%)
- Whites (57%) are more likely to select than African Americans (46%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (65%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (49%) or with some college (52%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more are the most likely to (63%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (58%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time (35%) or 2 times (45%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (60%) are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (50%) or 1 time (48%) a month
- Married (60%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (46%)

Men learn about and discuss biblical manhood

- Those age 50-64 (60%) and 65+ (58%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (38%) and 35-49 (48%)
- Whites (56%) are more likely to select than African Americans (46%)
- Those with some college (58%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (47%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more (60%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (48%) and 50-99 (47%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (59% v. 44%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (58%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (65%)
- Those at churches with an organized men’s ministry (57%) are more likely to select than those at churches with activities for men but nothing formal (43%)
- Married (59%) and Divorced (60%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (44%)

Opportunities are provided for men to grow as leaders

- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to select (38%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (63%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (44%) or with some college (51%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (55%) and 250 or more (59%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (30%) and 50-99 (45%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (55% v. 45%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (55%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time (35%) or 3 times (41%) a month
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (61%)
- Those at churches with an organized men’s ministry (54%) are more likely to select than those at churches with activities for men but nothing formal (44%)
- Single, Never Married are the least likely to select (39%)

Young men are mentored

- Those in the Northeast (64%) and South (64%) are more likely to select than those in the West (47%)
- Hispanics are the least likely to select (40%)
- Those with a Graduate Degree (66%) are more likely to select than those with a Bachelor’s Degree (51%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (65% v. 50%)
- Those who attend a worship service 2 times (62%) or 4 or more times a month (62%) are more likely to select than those who attend 3 times (46%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (64%) are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (49%) or 3 time (51%) a month

It reinforces what the church is encouraging

- Those age 50-64 (48%) and 65+ (51%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (35%) and 35-49 (38%)
- African Americans are the least likely to select (35%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (47%) are more likely to select than those who attend 3 times a month (36%)
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (54%)
- Widowed (67%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (40%) and Married (46%)
- Those without children under 18 living at home are more likely to select than those with children under 18 living at home (48% v. 35%)

It has strengthened my relationships with the men at my church

- Those age 18-34 are the least likely to select (29%)
- Whites (50%) are more likely to select than African Americans (38%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (52%) are more likely to select than churches of 50-99 (42%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (52% v. 39%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (52%)
- Those who attend small groups 2 times (50%) or 4 or more times (58%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (30%) or 3 times (36%) a month
- Married (53%), Divorced (50%), and Widowed (57%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (34%)

It has created an environment for me to share my struggles with other men

- Those age 35-49 (41%) and 50-64 (37%) are more likely to select than those and 65+ (27%)
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (23%)

I have experienced spiritual growth

- Those age 50-64 (56%) and 65+ (62%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (44%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more (60%) are more likely to select than churches of 50-99 (48%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (62%)
- Those who attend small groups 2 times (60%) or 4 or more times (63%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (49%) or 1 time (46%) a month

I became part of a brotherhood of like-minded men in my church

- Those in the Northeast (56%) are more likely to select than those in the Midwest (37%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (50%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (34%) and 250 or more (41%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (52% v. 33%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (50%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time (25%) or 2 times (33%) a month
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (25%)
- Married (47%) are more likely to select than Divorced (32%)
- Those without children under 18 living at home are more likely to select than those with children under 18 living at home (47% v. 37%)

“In what ways, if any, has your church’s men’s ministry provided you with help you would not have received without them?”

I have gained wisdom from more mature believers

- Those age 35-49 (57%) are more likely to select than those 65+ (42%)
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (36%)

I have helped other men in their walk with Christ

- Whites (38%) are more likely to select than Hispanics (26%)
- Those who attend a worship service 3 times (38%) or 4 or more times (39%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (18%)
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (16%)
- Single, Never Married (37%) and Married (38%) are more likely to select than Divorced (24%)

I have a greater understanding of my responsibility as a man, husband, and/or father

- Those age 35-49 (46%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (32%)
- Hispanics are the least likely to select (29%)
- Those with some college (47%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (37%)
- Those at a church with attendance of less than 50 are least likely to select (27%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (46%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time (26%) or 3 times (32%) a month
- Those who attend small groups 4 or more times a month (53%) are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (28%), 2 times (42%), or 3 times (34%) a month
- Married (48%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (32%)

“In what ways, if any, has your church’s men’s ministry provided you with help you would not have received without them?”

It has given me tangible ways to serve people in our local community

- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (34% v. 19%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month are the least likely to select (7%)
- Those who attend small groups 2 times (37%) or 4 or more times (36%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend zero times (13%) or 1 time (20%) a month

“In what ways, if any, has your church’s men’s ministry provided you with help you would not have received without them?”

I have developed significant relationships with men in different age groups than mine

- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month (40%) are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (19%)
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (22%)
- Those at churches with an organized men’s ministry (41%) are more likely to select than those at churches with activities for men but nothing formal (27%)

“In what ways, if any, has your church’s men’s ministry provided you with help you would not have received without them?”

There is more intentionality in my walk with Christ

- Those with a Graduate Degree (45%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (32%) or with a Bachelor’s Degree (31%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more (42%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (26%) and 50-99 (30%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (42% v. 24%)
- Those who attend a worship service 3 times (37%) or 4 or more times (39%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time (16%) or 2 times (25%) a month
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (20%)

“In the last year at your church, which, if any, of the following activities were offered for men?”

Gatherings with food (breakfasts, dinners, cookouts, feasts)

- Those age 50-65 (62%) and 65+ (68%) are more likely to select than those 35-49 (52%)
- Those in the West (65%) are more likely to select than those in the Northeast (51%)
- Whites are the most likely to select (64%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to select (53%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 100-249 (64%) and 250 or more (70%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (53%) and 50-99 (50%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (66% v. 52%)
- Those who attend a worship service 4 or more times a month are the most likely to select (67%)
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (48%)

Gatherings with food (breakfasts, dinners, cookouts, feasts) *continued*

- Those at churches with an organized men’s ministry (70%) and activities for men but nothing formal (64%) are more likely to select than those at churches with no activities for men (26%)
- Married (66%) are more likely to select than Single, Never Married (53%)

Gatherings with an outside speaker

- Those age 65+ (31%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (18%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less are the least likely to select (20%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more (35%) are more likely to select than churches of less than 50 (15%) and 50-99 (21%)
- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (31% v. 19%)
- Those who attend a worship service 3 times (25%) or 4 or more times (29%) a month are more likely to select than those who attend 1 time a month (12%)
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (15%)
- Those at churches with an organized men's ministry are the most likely to select (35%)

- Those with evangelical beliefs are more likely to select than those without evangelical beliefs (44% v. 33%)
- Those who attend a worship service 1 time a month are the least likely to select (23%)
- Those who attend small groups zero times a month are the least likely to select (24%)
- Those at churches with an organized men's ministry are the most likely to select (50%)

Gatherings with time for men to pray together

- Those age 50-64 (52%) and 65+ (49%) are more likely to select than those 18-34 (39%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (53%) or a Graduate Degree (55%) are more likely to select than those who are High School Graduates or less (44%)
- Those at a church with attendance of 250 or more are the most likely to select (61%)
